We sat through the service with a few other GIs and a group of long-bearded monks dressed in loin cloths. As we started to leave when the ceremonies were over, we passed a group of the monks sitting in the rear of the church. From the middle of the group one lanky monk emerged and greeted us by waving his hand. Then with that unmistakable drawl, he queried, 'Any of you folks from Texas?'"

When the officers recovered from their amazement, they learned that the monk formerly lived in west Texas, near El Paso, and had gone to the Holy Land on a pilgrimage 20 years ago—and decided to stay there.
