General Patton's tanks sweep to within 10 miles of Rhine and 10 miles of Cologne in southern area and seize Laun to southwest. To north, the First Army rapidly approaches Bonn, mopping up isolated Nazi pockets north of Cologne with aid of U. S. Ninth and Canadian First Armies. White flags were reported flying in Duisburg, on Rhine's east bank.
