

NOTICE OF MEETING

In the Matter of the Change of the Boundary of the PILOT ROCK GRAZING DISTRICT of Jackson County, Oregon.
To the GRAZING BOARD OF JACKSON COUNTY, OREGON, and to the ADVISORY BOARD OF THE PILOT ROCK GRAZING DISTRICT and to the Signers of the Petition for the Change of Boundary of the said PILOT ROCK GRAZING DISTRICT of Jackson County, Oregon, and to all Parties Interested in the said Grazing District. GREETINGS:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that on the 21st day of February, A. D. 1945, there was duly filed in the office of the County Clerk of Jackson County, Oregon, a petition in writing duly signed by twenty or more of the freeholders residing within the district boundaries of the said district, asking that the boundary of the said district as now organized and existing BE CHANGED so as to read as follows:

"Beginning at a point in the Northwest quarter of Section 29, in Township 39 South, Range 2 East of the W. M. Jackson County, Oregon, where the 'Old Pacific Highway' and the 'Ashland-Klamath Falls Highway' as said respective highways are now laid out, established and used, meet and intersect one with the other, and running thence in a westerly direction along the said 'Ashland-Klamath Falls Highway' to where said Highway cuts and intersects the north and south center line in Section 33, said Twp. and Range; thence North on said center line extended to the center of Section 28, said Twp. and Range; thence East, along said quarter section line extended a distance of 3 1/4 miles, more or less, to the Range Line between Ranges 2 and 3 East; thence South on said Range Line to the Northwest corner of Section 6, Twp. 40 South, Range 3 East of the W. M.; thence East on the Township Line between Townships 32 and 40, to the Northeast corner of Section 6, Twp. 40 South, Range 4 East of the W. M.; thence South, 3 miles, more or less, to the Southwest corner of Section 7, said Twp. and Range; thence East to the Southwest corner of Section 12, said Twp. and Range, said point being on the County Line between Jackson and Klamath Counties, Oregon; thence South on said County Line to where said County Line intersects the State Line between the States of Oregon and California; thence West on said State Line to where said State Line intersects the 'New Pacific Highway' as now laid out, constructed and used, thence following along the line of the said 'New Pacific Highway', as now laid out, constructed and used, in a northerly direction to where said 'New Pacific Highway' intersects the 'Old Pacific Highway', as now laid out, established and used; thence following along the line of the said 'Old Pacific Highway', as now laid out, constructed and used, to where the said 'Old Pacific Highway' cuts and intersects the said 'Ashland-Klamath Falls Highway', as aforesaid, being the true point of beginning as above set forth.

YOU ARE FURTHER NOTIFIED that a meeting of the Grazing Board of Jackson County, Oregon, has been duly called by the County Judge of said County, to be held at the hour of 10 o'clock A. M. on Monday the 18th day of March A. D. 1945, in the court room of said Court in the Courthouse in Medford,

Oregon, and such meeting will be held at said time and place for the consideration of the said petition, at which said time and place all persons interested in said Pilot Rock Grazing District are hereby required to appear and show cause, if any they have, why said Petition should not be granted, and why an election should not be called and held in the said District for the purpose of determining whether or not such proposed change in the boundary lines of the said District, as asked for in said Petition should not be made.

This NOTICE is given and mailed, posted and published, under and pursuant to an Order duly made and entered by the Jackson County Grazing Board under date of February 26th, 1945, as said Order now appears on file in my office, and to which said Order reference is hereby made.

There is no song which honors in a lusty chorus the stimulating charms of strychnine. Men do not brag of the amount of aspirin they can take without reeling around a room or stuporously slipping under the table.

Eh! I fooled you. That is not my sarcasm. I quote that paragraph from an article by Abraham Myerson, M.D., professor of psychiatry in Harvard Medical School, published in the February Survey Graphic, under the title "Roads to Alcoholism." I commend the article to every reader who likes an "occasional" drink, every occasional drinker who thinks he or she can take it or leave it alone, and every steady drinker who still feels an occasional qualm about frequent indulgence.

One man writes:

I have acquired the (I, Brady dare not mention the name of the nostrum here—but I dare say it is an acetanilid mixture) habit. When I go without it for a while I get terrific head pains—real or imaginary. Will appreciate any help you can give me in breaking this habit. I started taking the stuff after heavy drinking. Now I sometimes go for a month or more without a drink. If I do drink, my limit is two or three highballs, and I still feel the same need for the (nostrum). I am under constant business strain.

That lovable old character Uncle Sam who sanctions fatters and in many devious ways promotes the business of selling the nostrum indiscriminately to the ignorant Yankee public should be responsible now for your treatment in a sanitarium and for the support of your family while you are away from your job or business. Certainly the old grafter makes enough on the taxes paid by the nostrum manufacturer for the privilege of poisoning people who are childish enough to believe that the stuff is harmless or at least not dangerous to take if the government permits its indiscriminate sale.

The best help I can suggest for you, brother, is that you get in

touch with an Alcoholics Anonymous group in your community (find the address in telephone directory, maybe in a classified column) and attend their meetings. You will find them friendly and understanding—they have all had experience like yours.

From your letter it is impossible to judge whether yours is a case of switching from alcohol to drug or dope or from dope to alcohol. Heaven knows the disguised acetanilid alone can and does destroy the health of the frequent or habitual user and bring serious breakdown—in many instances on record it has brought death. Unfortunately for public welfare the sudden or tragic death in such a case is generally concealed under the plausible name of "heart failure."

Whether or not you follow my advice as to going to A. A. I do hope you will at least give yourself a break—undergo a careful examination by your physician to determine how much damage the acetanilid has done your heart, your blood and your nerves or young morale, so that the doctor may do what he can to correct the deficiencies he finds.

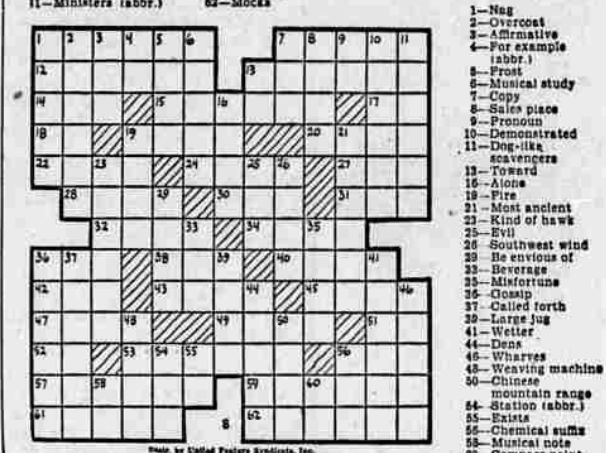
