

# FIRST LIBERATED PRISONER HOME FROM CABANTUAN

Sgt. William E. Davis, 31 among the prisoners-of-war liberated from the Japanese prison camp, Cabantuan, in the Philippine islands early in February has arrived in Medford to spend two months with his father, E. R. Davis, route 2, box 428. Sgt. Davis, who has gained about 60 pounds in weight in recent weeks, is reported to be in fair health but is to report to an army hospital at San Bernardino



at the end of the two months for an additional check-up. He has been in the army more than nine years.

Expected here some time this week are Cpl. Lorne Cox, son of John B. Cox, 515 West Jackson boulevard, and Master Sgt. George Distell, a friend, both of whom were also among those liberated from Cabantuan. All three men have been under the care of army doctors in Letterman hospital, San Francisco.

Both Mr. Cox and Mr. Davis went to San Francisco to visit their sons after their arrival at Letterman hospital, and Mr. Davis reported this morning that he spent many hours talking with the liberated soldiers. "My talks with those men have convinced me that reports of the camp conditions were all true," he said this morning. "Each man told little of himself, but would tell of experiences suffered by their buddies. All the men seemed to be normal and cheerful." Davis said army officials were struggling with the difficult task of reconstructing the records for each man, all lost with the fall of the islands.

# German Civilians Greet Yank Soldiers Waving White Flags

With the Fourth Armored Division inside Worms, March 22 — (U.P.) — The German soldier lay on the sidewalk, rolled into a blanket, with a bullet wound through his shoulder and tears in his eyes.

A German civilian stood next to me with his back to the soldier, ignoring his misery.

"Thanks," the German civilian said, "we are glad you have come."

It was the same way every mile from Alzey into Worms.

All along the road there were German dead and dying and knocked out German tanks. Yet when we entered a village the

people would come out with their white flags and large grins. It seemed almost as though the women, old men, and children of Germany have turned their backs on the German soldiers, saying: "Let happen what may to them — we must save ourselves."

At Worms itself only one German company took very long to make up its mind about surrendering. The town took our entry with almost a gala air.

One tall, blonde youth rushed up to our group of correspondents, calling: "Are you journalists? I am a German journalist. I am so happy to see you."

"Why?" we asked him.

"Now your bombers will come no more, we hope. Now we may get some rest."
