## WHAT'S THE MATTER WITH FATHER?

I am expecting our third baby (So begin, the prospective mother's letter. There is something wrong with that sentence. What's the matter with it? It becomes apparent as the letter goes on.)

In search of a doctor I interviewed an obstetrical specialist. (Something wrong with that sentence too. This may not become apparent, so we'll say an employer interviews applicants for a job, a reporter interviews persons or personages who desire publicity, a patient consults a physician or prospective parents engage a physician.)

Since I have had special-ize help before, and was shocked at his opinions and flimsy excuses, especially since he is supposed to be a doctor.

Something wrong about this sentence, too. Why the sudden lapse into the non-committal or furtive mood? Does the lady insinuate that ordinary folk suppose but not she, or that the doctor overplays his own importance? Nobody knows. That's the purpose of the furtive mood.)

Since he is supposed to be on the staff of three of the best hospitals. He told me the usual story about men being frail, and they have trouble with them. He said the Health Department had rules against that (presence of the prospective father during delivery), and that there are only a few little "off-brand" hospitals in the vicinity where the husband is permitted in the delivery room.

When he saw I didn't swallow such arguments, he tried another, telling me...

(Believe it or not, this debate occurred in May, 1944. This, when even common plodding practitioners, to say nothing of genuine specialists, have to turn away some new patients for sheer inability to give them the necessary attention. Well, let's see whether this merchant sold the lady a bill of goods.)

Telling me that husbands like to see their wives at their best and it is nicer to wait until afterward. Of course that was

the last straw. I could not engage him after that. But where shall I find a doctor who regards childbirth...? What can't doctors and hospitals see the human side? They seem to see only the biological aspect, such as a veterinarian would see in caring for stock. (Signed, Mrs. ...)

The remark that the Health Department has "rules" against presence of the husband is just a little bolder effort to deceive than the bombast about being on the staff of the best hospitals.

The veterinary's suggestion that men are frail and that husbands like to see their wives at their best—I'm afraid there is more truth in that, although the vet flatters such husbands by calling them men.

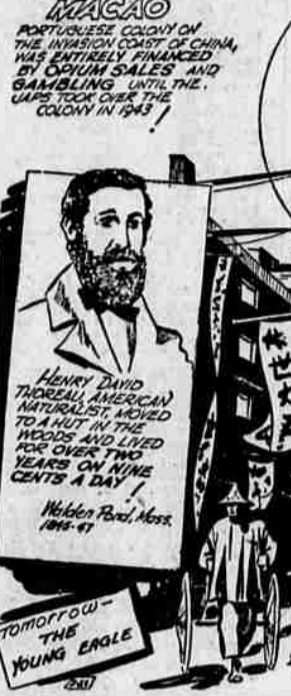
