## News From Jackson County for Men in the Armed Services

Spirits rose today, with the sun shining all day long and a touch of real spring in the air and everyone is looking forward to a bright Easter Sunday. All churches have planned the traditional Easter services and special Holy Week services have been held throughout the week. City schools have been closed since Tuesday afternoon.

Plans were announced this week for a new residential addition to Medford in the vicinity of Hillcrest Road and Valley View Drive to be known as Dean Park, after the owner and promoter, Dr. George B. Dean. Some 30 ultra-modern homes will be erected whenever materials are available. Business men point to steady increases in phone, electric and water con-

nections, the continued brisk real estate market and declare that the valley population is continuing to increase. Recordings in the office of the county clerk have required additional clerks for nearly three years past.

School children of Medford collected 35,000 pounds of scrap tin and the Ashland schools 10,000 pounds, in the recent drive. Easter vacation was lengthened a day as a reward for the excellent drive.

Medford Kiwanians devoted their weekly gathering this week to celebrating John Mann's 80th birthday anniversary.

Last Friday the Tribune began its 40th year of publication. Due to the acute newspaper

shortage, issues from Sunday to Wednesday were but four pages, with no display advertising.

Sgt. Lorne B. Cox, one of the men released from Cabantuan prison in the Philippine Islands February 2, arrived home today for a brief visit before being sent to Barnes hospital in Vancouver for treatment. He arrived in the United States March 8 and was first hospitalized in Letterman hospital at San Francisco.

Pfc. Kenneth Willard Ambrose has returned to this country after service in Europe and while hospitalized at Ft. Lewis found that the man two beds away, also just back from Europe, was a cousin whom he had never seen.

A purple heart was recently awarded to Pfc. Leonard S. Lyons, paratrooper and gunner, for wounds received in Belgium. He is hospitalized in England and his brother, Cpl. John Lyons, stationed in England, has been in for several visits. Pfc. Fred W. Lyon is also hospitalized in England for wounds received in the European theater and has been awarded the purple heart. Ardo Stocks, technician fifth grade, recently suffered wounds to his right eye, arm and hand while serving near Cologne.

Others on the wounded list are Pfc. Austin E. Caldwell, Sgt. Eloy Cordova, Pfc. Robert D. Hibbs, Cpl. Vaughn L. Groves, Pfc. Arleigh Kenyon and Cpl. Robert Gale. All but Groves and Kenyon were serving in the European theater.

Reported killed in action are Pfc. James Leabo on Luzon and Cpl. Robert Bischoff in Luxembourg. Staff Sgt. Dean Clark, B-29 gunner, and Sgt. Archie Harris of the 9th air force are reported missing. This week an air medal was awarded to Second Lt. Donald L. Peart, now a prisoner of the Germans, the medal being presented to his mother.

Marshall K. Williams, with the 7th army, has been promoted to fifth grade technician; James Grigebay, Jr., to electrician third class while serving on a naval transport; John Barber is now a staff sergeant with the 5th army; Jack Balding, with a QM depot in England, has been made a captain and John Salsberry, radarman on a Pathfinder plane, has been made a first lieutenant.

Lt. Raymond Proctor, recently promoted to first lieutenant with the 13th AAF, has been transferred from a South Pacific base to one in the Far East. Lt. Proctor holds the purple heart.

Home after service overseas are Fred H. Wilcox, Emlc; Second Lt. Royal D. Cooley, who made 35 flights over Germany; Lt. H. D. Byington of the navy; Lawrence G. Youmans, RdMlc and Col. Ben Harrell, who has been serving in Italy. Billy Ly-
