

CAPTORS OF CEBU DRIVE NORTHWARD TOWARD AIRDROME

Manila, March 31 (U.P.)—American troops captured Cebu's burned and blasted capital city and speared northward today in a drive that may have overrun the Lahug airdrome.

Cebu City, second largest city in the Philippines, fell to units of the American division which advanced five miles in one day and outflanked elaborate Japanese pillbox fortifications on the capital's western approaches.

The city, once one of the most beautiful in the Archipelago, was damaged nearly as badly as Manila. Demolition fires started by the Japanese when the Americans landed Monday, practically wiped out the business district and many residential sections.

Port Area Undamaged
The port area was reportedly found undamaged, however, and the excellent harbor, second

only to Manila, will be able to accommodate shipping and naval vessels almost immediately. The flanking maneuver by the Americans again caught the Japanese off guard and the enemy hastily evacuated well-placed pillboxes and buried tank defenses as the troops entered the city from the north and northwest.

Gen. Douglas MacArthur's communique said the conquest of the capital city was achieved with relatively light casualties.

U-BOAT BASES HIT BY BIG AIR FLEET

London, March 31 (U.P.)—More than 2,300 U. S. Eighth Air Force planes pounded Bremen, Hamburg and Wilhelmshaven today in the biggest American aerial attack ever made against German naval installations.

The huge assault by more than 1,400 Fortresses and Liberators, escorted by fighter planes, apparently was a bid to cripple finally the German naval facilities and U-boat fleet bases.

The attacks followed up raids last night by British mosquitoes on Berlin and other targets in northwest Germany.

JUNE 22 ELECTION TO COST AROUND \$75,000
Salem, Ore., March 31 (U.P.)—The June 22 special election, when the voters will decide on the fate of the proposed 2-cent cigarette tax and the 5-mill property levy, will cost around \$75,000, it has been estimated by David O'Hara, chief of the elections division here.

The election was called by the recent legislature to enable the state to raise \$14,000,000 in the next two years for the schools of the state and for institutional building. The smoke tax would be permanent, but the property levy would be for two years only.

Chicago, March 31 (U.P.)—A "the" instead of an "a" in a city ordinance yesterday cost Chicago \$9,591,000. A gas company, arguing against payment of taxes on natural gas sales, said a city ordinance reading "the 5 per cent tax" particularized the statement as referring to an 1891 franchise, expiring in 1916, whereas an "a" would have had an indefinite force. The court agreed.
