COLD WAVE HITS MIDWEST STATES

Chicago, April 5. — (U.P.) — A cold wave hit the midwest today perilling fruit crops in areas that escaped damage in yesterday's heavy snowstorm.

Temperatures dropped below the freezing mark from the Texas Panhandle to the Canadian border, sending the mercury down to the middle 20's throughout Iowa, Nebraska, Minnesota and the Dakotas. A low of 31 degrees was reported by the federal weather bureau in Chicago.

Snow blanketed large sections of Iowa, Nebraska, Wisconsin and the Dakotas. Twelve inches of snow fell at Mason City, Ia., yesterday and 15 inches was reported at Land O'Lakes, Wis.

Bernard Baruch Sees Work Boom

London, April 5. — (U.P.) — Bernard Baruch, President Roosevelt's personal emissary, believes that for five to seven years after the war there will be "more work in the United States than there are hands and minds with which to do it." Baruch, who likes to view the world and its affairs from a park bench, expressed the opinion to two passing American soldiers while he was perched in front of Hyde Park.
