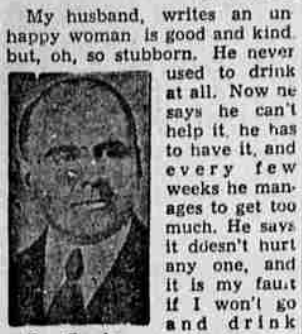

day were accorded top honors
in a national traffic safety con-
test in which all 48 states and
1,307 cities participated.
The two national grand prizes
were awarded to the city and

the judges, made the most out-
standing progress toward achiev-
ing traffic safety, despite war-
time hazards.
