their son, First Lt. Spencer B. Wells, Marine corps fighter pilot, who was reported missing in action in a wire received from the government March 2. The officer was hit by anti-aircraft fire while strafing the Yohasuka air field, Tokyo, the morning of Feb. 16, a letter to his parents states.

Lt. Wells was flying fast and low after making his run over the field and when hit plunged straight into the sea about 50 yards from shore, the letter explained. Fellow flyers stated that the officer had no chance to get out of his plane and was killed instantly, the correspondent reported.

Lt. Wells was born in Medford April 24, 1921. He graduated from Medford high school in 1938 and then attended the University of Oregon, where he was a junior when he entered naval aviation training. He was trained at St. Mary's pre-flight school and Livermore Field in California and was graduated as a marine corps pilot June 8, 1943, at the naval air station at Corpus Christi, Tex. After spending some months in operational training at Mojave air station, Cal., he went overseas in October of 1943. Following a year and a half of service in the Pacific area, Lt. Wells volunteered for service aboard a marine aircraft carrier of the Essex type.

At the University of Oregon Lt. Wells was a member of Theta Nu Epsilon society, Skull and Dagger and also of Phi Sigma Kappa, social fraternity. He served as class treasurer one year.

In addition to his parents, the lieutenant is survived by a brother, John C. S. Wells, Santa Rosa, Calif.
