

JACKSON SOLONS NAMED TO STATE INTERIM GROUPS

Salem, Ore., April 12—(U.P.)—Members of legislative interim committees appointed by Speaker of the House Eugene Marsh and Senate President Howard Belmont were announced by the two Oregon house leaders today.

The committees, appointed after passage of authorizing legislation by the recent 43d session of the Oregon legislature, will be active during the next two years and will report to the 1945 legislature.

An analysis of the state's tax system and other research will be made by the body which is to report recommendations during the next legislative session.

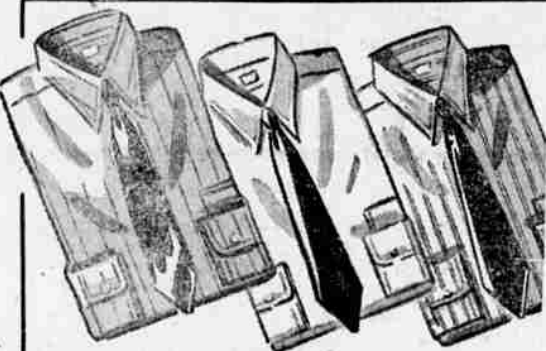
