New York, April 19.—(U.P.)—Ed Heusser's first pitching job of 1945, a 6 to 0 shutout for Cincinnati over Pittsburgh, held the Pirates to seven scattered singles and a double at Cincinnati. He walked only two men. The leading National league pitcher in the earned run department last year with an average of 2.38, he got off to a flying start in defending the mark. Only one man reached third and only two got as far as second.

Other pitchers were "on the beam" too, yesterday Paul (Dizzy) Trout shut out the Browns at St. Louis, 11 to 0. The Tigers made 21 hits, scoring three runs in the first inning off Brownie ace, Jack Kramer, to make Trout's work easy.

## Six-Man Battle Royal On Medford Mat Bill Tonight

Four of the toughest muscle maulers now campaigning in the Pacific northwest and a couple of scientific exponents of the game will clash in a six-man battle royal highlighting Promoter Mack Lillard's weekly wrestling session at Medford armory tonight.

Tony Morelli, who drew a six months suspension for dirty tactics in his last appearance here, has been secured by Lillard to take part in the free-for-all. Others in the fracas will be the Gray Mask, Terrible Tony Ross and Billy McEuin while Gust Johnson and Walter "Sneeze" Achieu, the only smooth performers on the card, round out the lineup.

Three regulation matches will follow the free-for-all, with wrestlers to be paired in order of their elimination. First two out will meet in the opening bout of three rounds, next pair out will clash in the four round semi-windup and the remaining two will meet in the six round main event.

Lillard cautioned fans that the Gray Mask will not be required to unmask if he loses but will be forced to remove his hood if he loses two falls, not by disqualification, in the ensuing match.

**IDAHO WILL RESUME FOOTBALL NEXT FALL**  
 Moscow, Idaho, April 19.—(U.P.) The University of Idaho today became the second member of the Pacific coast conference to announce the resumption of football next fall after a two-year lapse in gridiron activity.

J. A. Brown, acting director of athletics, announced that he had been authorized by the University Committee on Athletics to proceed with plans for resuming intercollegiate competition in football this year.

He added that no action had been taken in naming a head coach for the Idaho eleven.

## MEDFORD SCORES DUAL TRACK WIN OVER GRIZZLIES

Medford high school's track and field team yesterday won a dual meet with Ashland, 8 1/2 to 7 1/2, on the Medford track. Ashland took eight first places to Medford's six but the Tornado's second and third place awards gained the victory.

Gandee, Ashland, won the 100 yard dash in 10.7, Merriman, Ashland, took first in the high hurdles in 19.4, Whillock, Medford, was first in the shot put with a distance of 39 feet, 11 3/4 inches, Fullerton, Ashland, took first in the mile in 4.53, Merriman, Ashland, won the 440 yard dash in 55.4 and Ross, Medford, won the discus throw with a toss of 122 feet, nine inches.

Thompson, Ashland, pole vaulted 10 feet, two inches to win that event. Merriman, Ashland, was first in the low hurdles in 26.4, Carter, Medford, won the high jump with a leap of five feet, eight inches, Gandee, Ashland, won the 220 yard dash in 23.2, Carter, Medford, won the broad jump with 19 feet, eight inches, Fullerton, Ashland, won the 880 in .07 and Carter, Medford, won the javelin throw with 154 feet. Medford's relay team won the 880 yard relay in 1.37.

The two teams will meet again here next Tuesday in a dual practice meet and Medford travels to Klamath Falls April 28 for the annual invitational meet.

Chicago, April 19.—(U.P.)—In a complete reversal of form, Pitcher Mort and Catcher Walker Cooper of the St. Louis Cardinals went quietly back to work today after each had presented his argument for a \$3,000 raise to baseball's front office.

Their requests for \$15,000 salaries were taken under advisement yesterday by Leslie O'Connor, chairman of the baseball advisory council, after he conferred with them for 90 minutes.

Following the conference, O'Connor said he would consider the Cooper brothers' case for a couple of days and might talk by long distance telephone to President Sam Breadon of the Cardinals, who steadfastly has refused to meet his two stars' demands.

When asked what they would do if their salary demands were not met, Mort said, "We will abide by whatever Mr. O'Connor decides to do. We have submitted our case to him. That's enough."
