## ACUTE INFLAMMATORY RHEUMATISM

It is still necessary to stipulate that the name rheumatism applied to an ailment has no specific meaning. Call your complaint rheumatism if you like, until you or the doctor can find out what really is the matter. It is nearly if not quite as stupid and misleading as the term "cold" applied to any respiratory infection, allergic manifestation or exacerbation of chronic sinusitis, rhinitis, bronchitis, etc., when you have such trouble.

Frequently anxious parents ask for advice about a child's rheumatic fever (otherwise known as acute inflammatory rheumatism and acute infectious arthritis). Not because of any restraint imposed by medical ethics but simply because I dare not encourage and cannot condone neglect of a child or youth with such a serious illness. I cannot give such advice. If there is any complaint or illness that demands and should have the constant care of the physician, it is this joint inflammation. Upon the medical management of the patient from the onset of the illness until the fire has surely gone out and the patient has been educated valves of the heart, depends perhaps the en-

fire future welfare and happiness of the young patient. As I have acknowledged in preceding talks, the specific cause of rheumatic fever in most instances; is infection with any of the various strains of the notorious Streptococcus, and the infection is usually a respiratory infection. Indeed, rheumatic fever and its grave complications or consequences (damage to heart lining, valvular leakage) must be reckoned among the penalties children have to pay for the ignorance and unteachableness of parents, physicians, health authorities and the majority of wisecracking adults — all of whom contribute to the spread of respiratory infection every time they assume or pretend an indisposition or an illness is "just a cold."

Tonillitis has occurred so frequently before the development of rheumatic fever (acute inflammation of one and then another joint) that some good physicians have regarded it as the cause of rheumatic fever. This observation probably accounts for the enthusiasm, lately curbed, for the atrocious tonsillectomy that has been perpetrated on so many children by doctors of radical tendencies.

Rheumatic fever, acute infectious (that is, of bacterial causation) arthritis, inflammatory rheumatism, is painful while the joint or joints are inflamed, red and swollen, but what makes it so serious an illness is the ever present chance that some of the bacteria (Streptococci) may lodge upon the lining of the heart and set up an inflammation there (endocarditis), and if this endocarditis happens to involve the heart lining that composes part of a heart valve it is not unlikely to damage the valve, roughen it or distort it, so that the valve no longer closes completely, and that permits some backflow of blood through the valve at each heart beat — valvular leakage.

## Japs Fear Invasion; Reshuffle Bureaus

Washington, April 23.—(U.P.)—Japan, frantically preparing against an Allied invasion, announced today the "biggest reshuffling" of administrative authorities since the outbreak of the war.

Greater power has been placed in the hands of local administrative authorities "in event of an invasion of the homeland and to increase war production," according to broadcasts recorded by the federal communications commission.

Japanese political observers termed the reshuffle "as taking into full account the increasing importance of the local administrations with respect to national defense," broadcasts said.

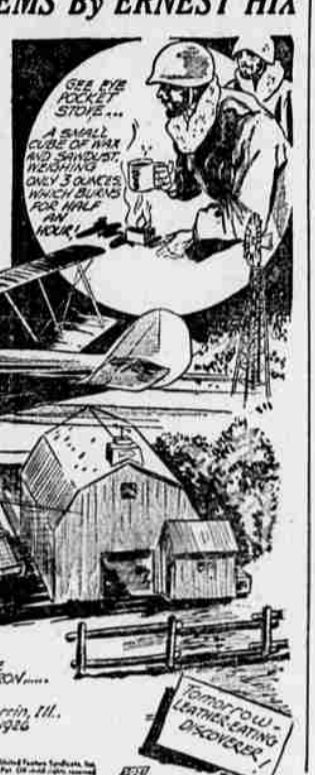
