TEN OLD TIMERS HONORED BY HIGH BASEBALL AWARD

New York, April 26—(U.P.)—The doors of baseball's hall of fame at Cooperstown, N. Y., opened wide today for 10 great old timers whose feats of deerling-do on the diamond occurred before 1910.

Among the players chosen, Jimmy Collins, former Boston Red Sox third baseman, and Roger Bresnahan, New York Giant catcher who died recently, were on the list of candidates of the Baseball Writers association, but both failed to receive the necessary 75 per cent majority.

The others named were Hugh Jennings, shortstop and manager of the Detroit Tigers; Uncle Wilbert Robinson, catcher for the old Baltimore Orioles and late manager of the Brooklyn Dodgers; Dan Brouthers, Detroit outfielder and one of the game's finest hitters; Fred Clark, outfielder and manager of the Pittsburgh Pirates; E. Delahanty, pitcher for the Washington Senators and Philadelphia Phillies; Hugh Duffy, still a coach and scout for the Boston Red Sox and a former outfield star with both Boston clubs; Mike Kelly, Boston Red Sox and Chicago Cubs' catcher who made famous the cheer "Slide Kelly Slide," and Jimmy O'Rourke, New York catcher, who also played with the old Buffalo National League club.

The committee which met to select the old timers was made up of Edward Barrow of the New York Yankees, Connie Mack of the Philadelphia Athletics, Bob Quinn of the Boston Braves, Stephen C. Clark, president of the Cooperstown museum; Paul Kerr, secretary of the museum, and Baseball Writer Melville Webb of the Boston

Globe. Another member, Sid Mercer, New York Journal-American baseball expert, was unable to attend.

The new selections brought to 38 the number of baseball immortals enshrined at Cooperstown.

HOLLYWOOD TAKES 3 TO 0 WIN OVER SEATTLE RAINIERS

Evanston, Ill., April 26—(U.P.)—Coach Bob Feller, former Cleveland Indian pitching star, took it easy yesterday when he pitched three innings as his Great Lakes baseball team defeated Northwestern, 12-2. But he proved he still has the flaming fast ball which made him the scourge of American League batters.

Feller, a chief specialist at Great Lakes, fanned seven men and issued no walks although he allowed two hits when he eased up against the Collegians. It was his first pitching performance since returning to the United States after more than two years duty on the high seas.

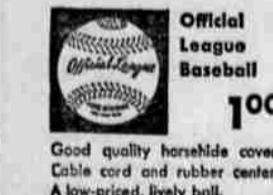

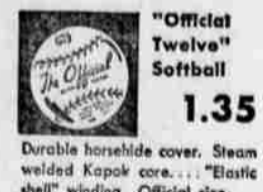
