NO CLASS IN GERIATRICS TODAY

Dr. Brady doctor's teaching or with the correspondent's pride; that is, the doctor fails to translate his lecture into language the layman can understand, or the correspondent is too proud to ask for an explanation.

Well, anyway, the tenor of the correspondent's query reminded me once again of the confusion of tongues that causes so much misunderstanding between the medical profession and the public. I've been working at it for a long time and by now I should be a fairly good interpreter of medical parlance for the man in the street. But almost every day letters from readers make me painfully aware of my incompetence as a teacher.

So there will be no class in geriatrics today, children. Geriatrics—that's the branch or specialty of medicine devoted to the diagnosis and treatment of diseases of the mature or elderly. Pediatrics, as many know, is the branch or specialty of medicine devoted to the diagnosis and treatment of diseases of children. A physician whose practice is limited to the latter is a pediatrician or pediatricist. So a physician who limits his practice to the former is a geriatricist or geriatrician—but we are getting too far ahead of progress here, for as yet, so far as I know, not one physician has had the courage to hold himself out as a practitioner of geriatrics exclusively—a striking contrast with the milling herds of ambitious young doctors who enter practice as full-fledged "child specialists" and very often, actually get away with it, that is, so far as making an easy living goes.

But don't disappoint you to find this is not a clinic, not if you have followed this column very long. Always we accentuate the prophylaxis. Prophylactic is anything that prevents or contributes to the prevention of disease. Although we leave geriatrics to the physicians, it is still the aim, and I think the proper province of this department, to hold these conversations on gerontology with all who care to join our class. Gerontology is the study or science of the physiological and pathological changes incident to mature age.

Here we are concerned primarily with hygiene, nutrition, physiology, prophylaxis or prevention of degeneration and disease, and it makes no difference how many years you have been knocking about or how many years you may have still to go, it is never too early and never too late for you to learn something about these aspects of gerontology. So don't go away disappointed, if you came for the geriatrics class. Draw up a will and sit down. Pretend you are just amused at these old codgers here—and just listen. What you'll hear will at least do you no harm.

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

Eye Color

Is it possible for a man and wife having eyes of the same color to have a child born to them with eyes of a different color?
Answer—Yes. If both parents are brown-eyed all of their children may be brown-eyed, but one child may be blue-eyed and two or three other children brown-eyed. All eyes are more or less brown, remember. What are called "blue" eyes are eyes with the least pigment in the iris—and so-called "black" eyes have the most pigment in the iris (color ring around the black central dot called pupil). Albino's eyes appear pink color (color of retina showing through the iris which have no pigment at all, but in all instances the pigment is always one color, in every race and every individual, brown.
