TONSILS AND ADENOIDS

Extremely large tonsils, whether they are associated adenoid thickening or enlargement or not, often are responsible for the "adenoid facies" as well as other manifestations or symptoms which are wrongly ascribed to adenoids.

If your children have large tonsils, therefore, don't get morbid about it. What they need fundamentally is more air, more daytime air as well as more night air. They will get it, all right, if you are not too old and set in mind to put aside your superstitions or quaint fancies of "taking cold" from "exposure" to everyday environment.
