

District Track Meet To Be Held Here Saturday

Six schools will be represented in the district track and field meet to be held at the high school track tomorrow afternoon at 1:30. Al Simpson, Medford coach, said today. Schools to be represented are Grants Pass, Ashland, Klamath Falls, Rogue River, Eagle Point and Medford. Eagle Point is entering only one man who will compete in the 440-yard dash and the broad jump, Simpson said.

Qualifying events for the 100 and 220-yard dashes will be held tomorrow morning, beginning at 10:30. There are seven entries in each hurdle race and if one can be scratched there will be no need of running off hurdle qualifications, Simpson said.

Ribbons To Winners
Medford, host team, will present ribbons to each person taking any of the first four places in any event. First and second place winners in each event will be eligible for the state track meet at Corvallis, May 11 and 12.

Simpson said he did not expect any district records to fall by the wayside tomorrow although the 440-yard and 100-yard records may be endangered.

Klamath Falls appears to be the favorites since they have yet to lose a meet this year and have a well-balanced squad. Henthorne, Pope, Foster and Palmer have sparked the Pelicans to three straight victories.

Ashland's Fullerton, Gandee, Tison, Thompson and White are expected to place the Grizzlies well up in the standings while Medford will be banking their hopes on Carter, Bostwick and Ross.

Rogue River Entry
Junior Dimick, in the sprints, will be a plug for Rogue River while Clark, state mile champion the past two years and holder of the district record of 4:37, seems slower than in his last showing but still should outclass the field, Simpson claimed.

Paul Davis, Grants Pass, will be the official starter and J. C. Tucker, Medford, and Ivor Erwin, Ashland, will be timers. Ralph McCollough, Ashland, and Lynn Mills and Norman Sting, Medford, have been named as finish judges. Field judges will be Ed Kirtley and Lester Harris, Medford, and Jake Shaffer, Ashland. Bob Watson will be official scorer.

DRAFTING OF PRO ATHLETES PROBED

Washington, May 4.—(U.P.)—The war department is investigating charges by Rep. Melvin Price, D., Ill., that professional athletes classified 4-F have been inducted into the armed services regardless of physical disabilities.

Price, who protested to the war department that some athletes were taken into the army without even a change in their 4-F classification, said he expected a revision of the draft regulations within a few days.

Price said he sought no special privileges for athletes, only a "fair deal." He charged the army was discriminating against athletes when it inducted men who

did not meet the minimum physical requirements.

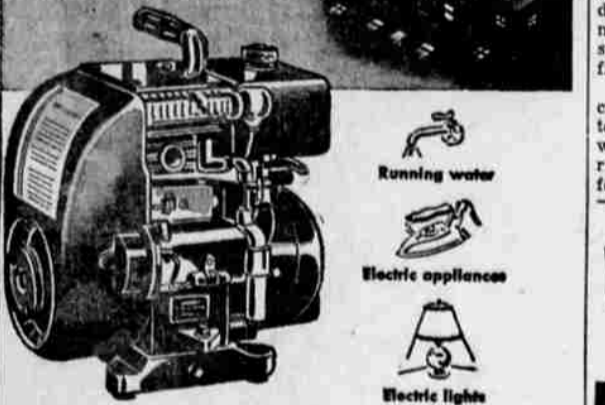

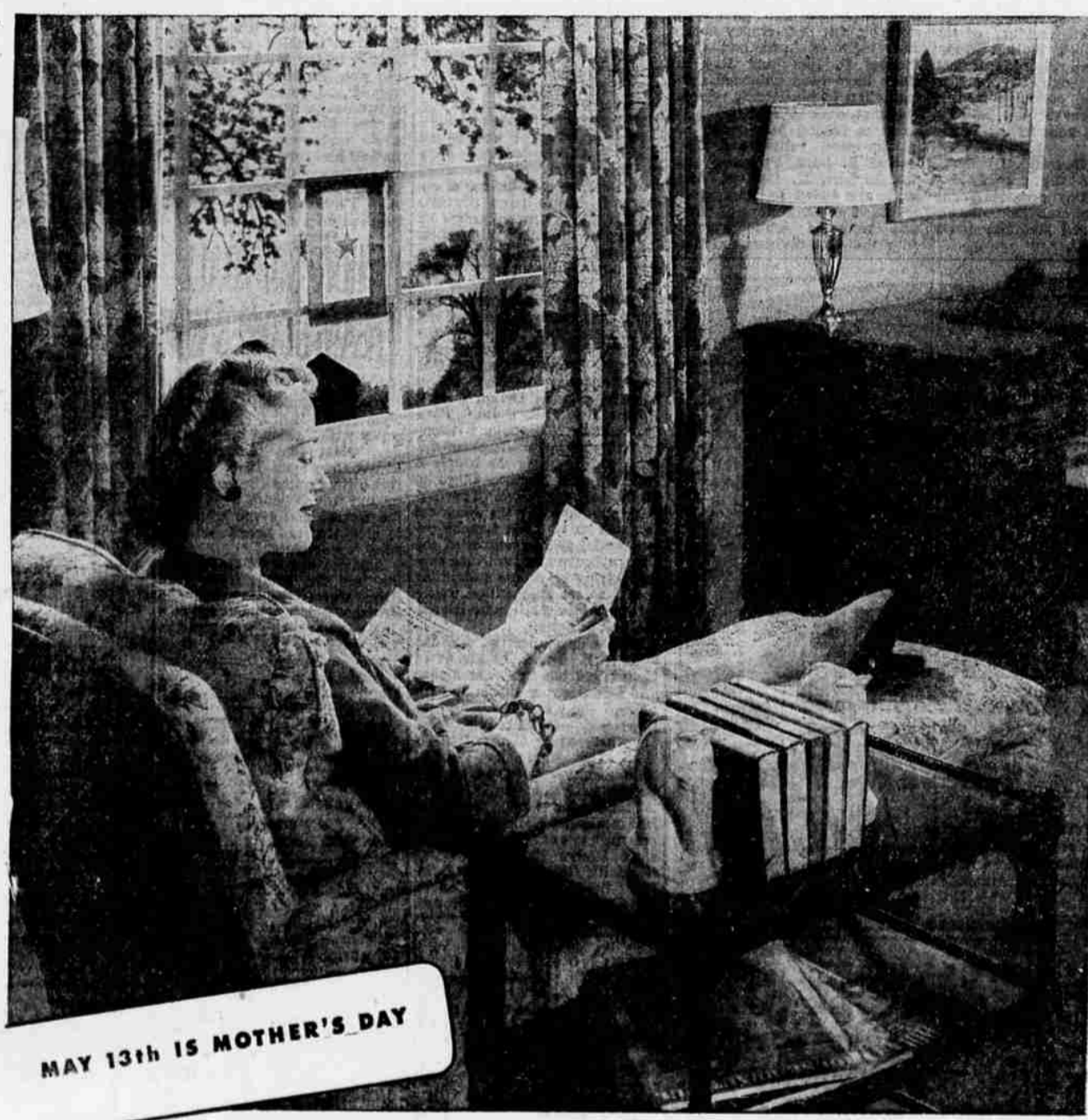
