

1945 'MRS. ENOCH ARDEN' TO AWAIT WORD FROM HUBBY

Long Beach, Cal., May 5—(U.P.) A modern "Mrs. Enoch Arden" decided tonight to await word from a husband "returned" from the dead before tackling the problem of what to do with a second husband, "a swell guy."

Mrs. Robert A. McDowell was skeptical that the first man she had married, Lt. Harold Goad, 27, was found alive in a Rangoon hospital. Since the War Department officially declared him dead Oct. 31, 1944, she married Ens. Robert A. MacDowell, of Saugerties, N. Y., who left for overseas last month.

Mrs. MacDowell, 22, a blue-eyed, honey-blond, will leave Tuesday for Portsmouth, O., to discuss with relatives a situation that counteracts Tennyson's Enoch Arden, a story of a woman who happily remarried when she thought her sailor husband was lost at sea.

COOS BAY DREDGE PROJECTS TALKED

Portland, Ore., May 5—(U.P.)—Dredging projects in Coos Bay, which allegedly will facilitate lumber loading on ships, is under consideration by army engineers, Col. Ralph Tudor said today.

Steamship and lumber company representatives are urging that a main ship channel in Coos Bay be dredged to a depth of 30 feet, and a bar at bay entrance to 40 feet.

According to them, many vessels are unable to load to capacity at Coos Bay, Empire, or Charleston under present conditions, and are forced to go to other west coast ports to finish taking on cargoes.
