# HORSE RACING IS GIVEN GO-AHEAD; PARKS ARE READY

New York, May 10—(U.P.)—Racing was getting set today for nationwide resumption after paying its war-time obligation to the government with a five-month shut-down.

There will be at least two tracks, Narragansett in Rhode Island and Sportsman's Park in Chicago, in operation by this week-end. By the middle of next week two others, Pimlico at Baltimore, and Churchill Downs at Louisville, Ky., will have their belated spring meetings under-way, preliminary to the running of the two great three-year-old classics, the Kentucky Derby and the Preakness.

Trains Moved  
Turfmen moved at almost thoroughbred speed themselves in getting schedules arranged after the announcement by War Mobilizer Fred M. Vinson in Washington yesterday that the government ban against operation of the tracks had been lifted.

Plans were almost completed for the running of the 71st Kentucky Derby on June 2 and the Preakness at Baltimore was set tentatively for the following Saturday, June 9. The third big race for three-year-olds, the Belmont stakes in New York, will be held either on June 23 or June 30, metropolitan racing officials indicated.

Arcadia, Cal., May 10—(U.P.)—Scenic Santa Anita race track, shut down twice in the last three years on the eve of 55 day meetings, today was reported to have settled for a 35 or 40 day meeting to make way for a summer program at Bing Crosby's Del Mar club.

## SENTENCES METED IN HOOP SCANDAL

New York, May 10—(U.P.)—The conviction of Harvey Stemmer and Henry Rosen for conspiracy and bribing five Brooklyn college basketball players, was cited today by Judge Louis Goldstein as a warning to "those chiseling and crooked gamblers who infect our proud city that New York is not a safe place to operate."

Stemmer and Rosen were found guilty by a jury of eight men and four women after five hours of deliberation last night. The jury recommended leniency for Rosen, who acted as a go-between in the deal with the players to "fix" a game with Akron university at Boston on Jan. 31.

Stemmer promptly was sentenced to a year in the penitentiary and fined \$500 with the proviso that he must serve an extra day for each dollar of the fine he fails to pay. Rosen will be sentenced on May 16.

## BUDGET INCLUDES \$1500 LAND ITEM

The Jackson county budget for the 1945-1946 tax year will contain a \$1,500 item for the reclassification of land in Jackson county, County Assessor C. A. Myers reports. The program will require several years and the state tax commission has promised to assign a land expert here to assist, with the county paying the major portion of the costs. The project would include the entire county and is expected to adjust several land problems that have prevailed for several years. The land will be classified tillable or non-tillable and valuations of improvements set under the plan.

Scaled proposals addressed to the City Water Commission, City Hall, Medford, Oregon, and endorsed "Proposal for Reservoir Construction", will be received at the office of the Commission at Medford, Oregon until 7:30 P.M., P.W.T., on the 31st day of May, 1945 and thereafter will be publicly opened and read.

The proposed work consists of the construction of an 8,200,000 gallon reinforced concrete reservoir to be located upon Capital Hill within the city limits of Medford, and adjacent to two existing embankment type reservoirs having capacities of 2,000,000 gallons each. The work also includes the installation of pipe lines, valves and a flow meter required to connect the proposed reservoir with the City water supply line and distribution system.

The principal items upon which bids are invited are:  
1. Common Excavation, 7,000 cu. yds.  
2. Rock Excavation, 18,600

cu. yds.  
3. Reinforced Concrete, 1,820 cu. yds.

4. Installing 6" to 24" Cast Iron Pipe, 2,480 cu. yds.

Copies may be obtained upon the receipt of \$10.00 or a check for \$10.00 made payable to the Medford Water Commission. The deposit will be refunded in case a bonafide bid is submitted and the plans and specifications are returned in good condition. Otherwise the deposit will be retained.

All proposals must be on the regular blank forms furnished with the Specifications and must be accompanied by certified check payable to the Medford Water Commission in an amount equal to or exceeding five per cent (5%) of the total bid. A one

hundred per cent (100%) corporate surety performance bond will be required to guarantee the faithful performance of the Contract. The successful bidder must also show evidence of adequate liability and property damage insurance.

The right is reserved to postpone making the award for a reasonable length of time or to reject any or all bids, for good and sufficient reasons, and to accept the proposal deemed in the best interest of the Commission, regardless of bid prices.

A priority rating of AA-3 has been granted for the project by the War Production Board.
