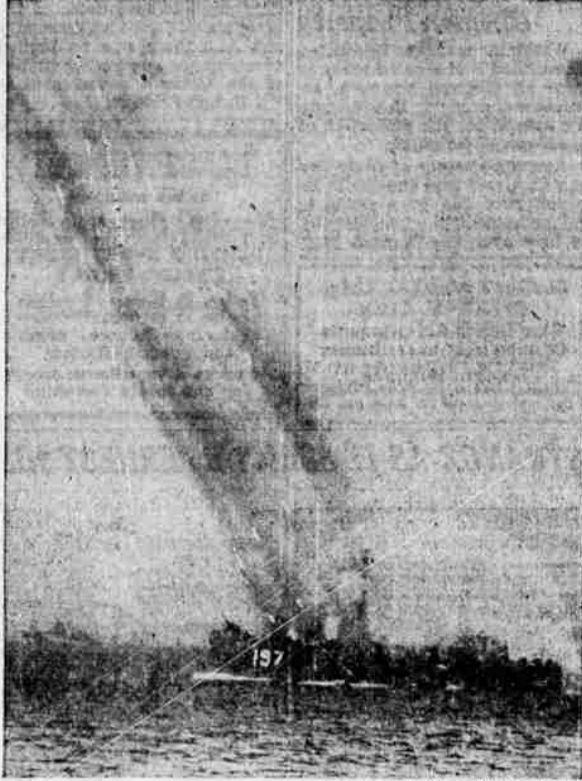

New York, May 10 — (UP) — Selling pressure increased on the stock market today. Prices had their worst break since March 26 on increased volume.

Two reasons stood out for the selling. The top one was the indication as expressed by Secretary Morgenthau that the administration will fight any proposals for a general tax relief at the present time. The second, losing in favor, was that the market was entitled to a drop at this time to consolidate the recent gains.
