COURT TO SELECT SERVICE OFFICER

The Jackson county court, acting in conjunction with the commanders' council of county veterans organizations, has under consideration the appointment of a service officer to serve the needs of all veterans of the county. Appointment will be made at the start of the fiscal year, July 1.

Applications, in writing, may be mailed to the county court. Applicants are asked to give their qualifications, age, place of residence and to state whether or not they are veterans.

The successful applicant must be capable of dealing with federal and state bureaus and must know the laws as to what benefits a soldier is entitled. The salary has not yet been fixed, according to the court.
