

ARTHUR BROTHERS CIRCUS TO SHOW HERE TOMORROW

The spirit of the circus will be in the air tomorrow when Arthur Brothers circus, with its trumpeting bands, red wagons, spangles and pink lemonade invades Medford for two showings, at 2:30 and 8 p. m., with doors scheduled to open an hour earlier to allow patrons a leisurely hour to visit the managerie. The special steel railroad equipment will start to arrive about dawn over the Southern Pacific tracks and a goodly gathering of youngsters and grown-ups are expected to gather around the railroad yards to watch the unloading.

Railroad issues, weak yesterday, came back fractions to two points in Norfolk and Western. Santa Fe, Gulf Mobile and Ohio, Nickel Plate preferred, Chicago Great Western preferred, and Baltimore and Ohio gained a point or more.

Hudson featured the motors in turnover and gained a fraction. Other motors were firm. Studebaker made a new high and held half of a one-point rise made at the opening. American Airlines lost a point while transcontinental and Western rose a point. U. S. Rubber rose a point in its department. Lockheed made a new high to feature the aircrafts. Gold mining shares made new highs early in the day and then turned irregular.

Preliminary closing Dow-Jones averages: Industrial 163.21 up 0.12; rail 55.18 up 0.48; utility 30.49 up 0.04; and 65 stocks 61.21, up 0.18. Sales were 1,070,000 shares, smallest volume since April 12, and compared with 1,510,000 yesterday.

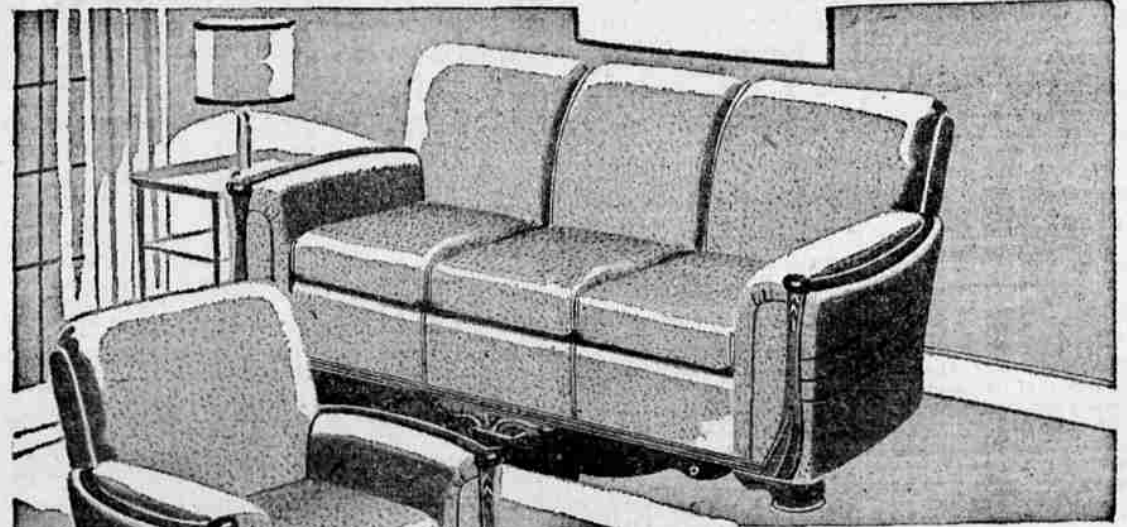

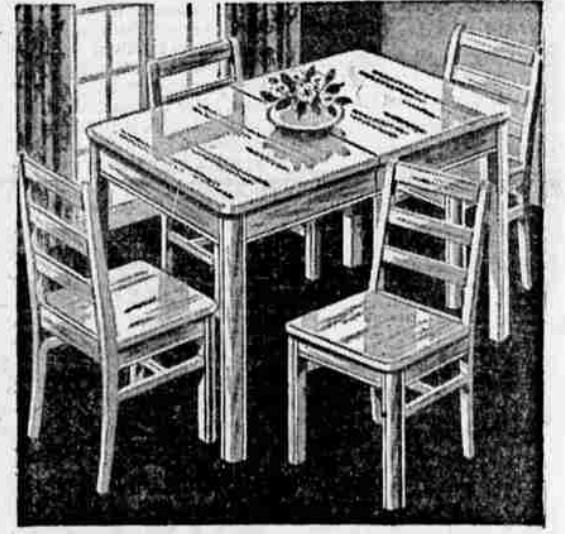
