## CAPTAIN FUSON GIVES ACCOUNT OF EXPERIENCE

A letter recently received by Mr. and Mrs. Thomas J. Fuson, box 149, from their son, Capt. T. J. Fuson, medical officer with the American army in Germany, told of some of his experiences while serving with a hospital unit.

Capt. Fuson wrote of aiding in establishing a hospital for former slaves of the Reich in the Roer pocket. He was made professional consultant and supervised a staff of German medical corpsmen, 20 German army nurses, 28 corpsmen and 50 civilian nurses.

Capt. Fuson wrote that the advancement of German medical science was far below that of the United States. "They knew nothing of penicillin until we introduced them to it," he wrote. They used no plasma and had only two or three of the earlier sulfa drugs which we discarded years ago in favor of superior ones, according to the letter.

In writing of the German concentration camps, Capt. Fuson said, "You've surely been reading of the concentration camps that have recently been overrun by red-eyed G.I.'s—it's nauseating. I've seen enough already to make me hate the Germans and everything they stand for, for the rest of my life. No treatment of them can be too severe."
