

GRANTS PASS AND EUGENE TO HOST SHRINE CEREMONY

Ceremonials for Hillah Temple nobles will be held at Eugene May 18 and at Grants Pass June 16, according to an announcement in the Red Fez, official publication of the Shrine's Hillah Temple.

In the Eugene ceremonial registration will be held at the Osborne Hotel at 2:30 p. m., with Recorder R. E. Detrick receiving the large group of nobles. At 4 p. m. a business session will be held at the hotel with the social hour at Eugene armory an hour later. At 6 p. m. the traditional feast will be spread for nobles and novices.

Following the banquet a band concert will open festivities for the evening with presentation of Illustrious Potentate Sam Steinbaugh, Grants Pass, his divan and distinguished guests at 8 p. m. Thirty minutes later the first and third sections will be staged after which the second section will find the trembling novices struggling across the scorching sands on their pilgrimage to Mecca.

Grants Pass will host the second of the two spring ceremonials with Past Potentate Austin Brownell to head committees in charge of all arrangements. Past Potentate A. K. Cass will be master of ceremonies.

After Recorder Detrick registers the array of candidates at the Redwoods Hotel at 2:30 p. m., ceremonial festivities will adjourn to the Josephine county fairgrounds for the business session, social hour and serving of fried chicken to hold attention of nobles and novices. FORD FACTORY AT COLOGNE STARTS

With Occupation Forces, Germany, May 14—(U.P.)—Motor trucks are rolling off assembly lines of the Ford Motor company plant in Cologne in the first industrial revival of its kind since the allied occupation of Germany, it was disclosed today.

The first of 3,000 2½-ton trucks, expected to be assembled mostly from material already available, was ready V-E Day.

The plant is using German workmen who had operated it for the nazis and who have been rehired after careful screening by intelligence officials.
