Chris C. Speaker, T/5, was reported killed in action April 19 with the First army in Germany, according to word received by his wife, Mrs. Verna M. Speaker, 613 North Bartlett street, last week. His parents reside at San Dimas, Calif.

The deceased was born Sept. 8, 1918, in Fuyallup, Wash. He attended Medford schools and worked for the Medford Corporation in 1941 and 1942. He entered the army in November, 1942, trained at Ft. Lewis, Wash., and went overseas in March, 1944.

Besides his wife and parents, Speaker is survived by two brothers, Sgt. Ernie Speaker, now in the Philippines; and Pfc. Dorwyn Speaker, in France; two sisters, Mrs. Lois Denton, with her parents, and Mrs. Phyllis Brewer, East Highlands, Calif.
