LYTTON IVANHOE DIES IN BRAZIL

Lytton Ivanhoe, about 55 and well known in the valley during the 1920's, passed away in Rio De Janeiro, Brazil, today, according to word received here. Death was attributed to heart failure. The former California Oregon Power company employe had been employed in the public utilities in Brazil for the past 18 years.

He is survived by his wife, a son, Lytton, Jr., in the east, two daughters in Berkeley, Calif., and a daughter in the WACS, stationed in Paris. Three children, making their home in Brazil, also survive as does a brother in the navy.
