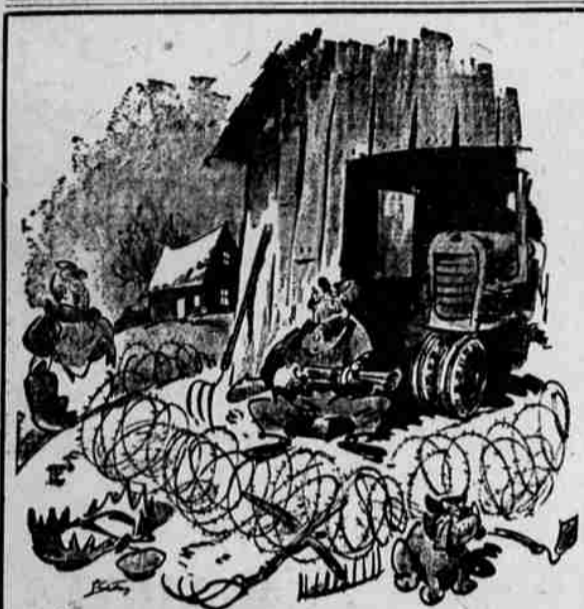


GREAT LAKES WIN

FAWCETT HURLS TORNADO TO 5-2 LEAGUE VICTORY

Behind the four-hit pitching of Dick Fawcett, the Medford Tornado baseball team defeated Ashland 5 to 0 here Friday afternoon in the final game of the southern Oregon conference. The victory gave Medford a tie with Grants Pass for leadership of the league. Ashland ended up in last place, failing to win a conference game. J. C. Tucker, Medford coach, said there will be no play-off with Grants Pass. Fawcett was credited with 15 strikeouts while Reedy of Ash-

land whiffed two. Mitchell, who relieved Reedy in the ninth inning, also fanned two. Fawcett was in trouble only once, in the seventh inning when Ashland got two hits and a walk to load the bases with none on. The little Medford hurler handed the situation well by striking out the next three Grizzly batters. Fawcett and catcher Bob Watson carried the biggest sticks for Medford, each getting three hits out of four trips to the platter. Two of Watson's blows were doubles. Medford collected 11 hits.

YANKS WIN FOUR IN ROW FROM SOX; TIE WITH BROWNS

New York, May 26 — (U.P.)—The New York Yankees whipped the White Sox today, 13 to 0, putting down for the time being the pennant pretensions of the Chicagoans and setting up Sunday's Yank-St. Louis Brown doubleheader as a fight for the American league lead. It was the fourth straight loss for the Chicagoans at the hands of the Yanks, and dropped them from second to third place. The Yanks waded through the vaunted White Sox hurling staff with little regard for their records, and today "thumped" their ace, Thornton Lee. Lee gave up six runs before being lifted in the sixth, and Johnson and Touchstone had no better luck in muffling New York bats.

The Browns kept pace with New York by defeating the Boston Red Sox, 9 to 2. Detroit edged the Philadelphia Athletics, 5 to 4. Eddie Mayo made four hits to lead the Tigers, and his seventh-inning double, followed by Cullenbine's single, proved to be the winning run. Rain washed out the Cleveland-Washington game.

In the National league, the New York Giants kept well ahead of the pack by thumping Cincinnati again, 5 to 1. Paul Erickson made his 1945 debut for the Chicago Cubs a winning one, a four-hit 2 to 1 decision over the Philadelphia Phillies. Bill Lee gave the Cubs only five hits, but his control faltered in the ninth inning and he gave up a single and then walked three straight batters, forcing in the winning run.

Rain stopped the Pittsburgh-Boston game in the third inning with the score 6 to 1 in favor of Pittsburgh.

BOB WATSON ON ALL-STATE NINE
Bob Watson, catcher on the Medford high school baseball team, has been selected to play in the All-American Boys Baseball contest at Vaughn Street park in Portland Decoration day. Watson, along with other players, will visit the Shrine hospital for crippled children Monday morning before engaging in his first batting and fielding drill for the game which will decide the Oregon players to represent the state in the national contest to be held in New York in August.

Watson batted .387 in eight games which Medford played during the season which ended Friday.

ARMY WINS OVER NAVY TEAM, 7 TO 2
West Point, N. Y., May 26 — (U.P.)—Army's baseball team defeated Navy 7 to 2 today in the traditional service classic at Doubleday Field.

While 5,000 cadets and officers roared approval, Dick Kinney, Laconia, N. H., right hander, struck out eight Middle batters and was in complete command of the game throughout. Except for teammate Josey's fielding lapse in the fifth, Kinney might have had a shutout as both Navy runs were scored on a bad throw with two men aboard.

It was Army's 14th straight victory of the season and they now lead the Navy 23 to 15 in the series which began in 1901.

MICHIGAN LOSES TITLE TO ILLINOIS
Champaign, Ill., May 26 — (U.P.)—The brilliant performances of three "cripples," and the surprise running of a Negro freshman, George Walker, and a hot sun enabled Illinois to upset Michigan's defending champions today and win its first Big Ten track and field championship since 1934.

Illinois scored 65½ points; Michigan, seeking its third consecutive title, finishing second with 56 1/6 and Minnesota came in third with 27½ points. Illinois, with three of its champions nursing injuries, was counted out of the running in pre-meet speculation and Michigan was practically conceded the title.

NOVA COMES OFF CANVAS TO BEAT DENSON IN SIXTH

Boston, May 26 — (U.P.)—Lou Nova, 205, Van Nuys, Cal., came off the canvas tonight to knock out Johnny Denson, 197½, Indianapolis in the sixth round of their scheduled 10-round bout at Mechanics' building before 1,593 fans. Nova was down for a nine count in the first round after Denson scored with a straight righthand punch to the jaw. Nova's knees buckled as he rose and he fell back on the ropes while Denson desperately tried to knock him out. The bell, however, sounded the end of the round.

For the next five rounds, it was clearly Nova's fight as he battered Denson back and forth across the ring and was only slightly bothered by the Hoosier heavyweight's left jab. The bout drew a gross gate of \$2,593 for a net of \$1,813. In preliminaries: Henry Jones, 212, Philadelphia, defeated Colin Chaney, 190, Indianapolis (8); Jerry Berthiaume, 176, Pawtucket, R. I., technically knocked out Dave Horblitt, 177, Peabody (4); Eddie Adourian, 163½, Pawtucket, defeated Alex Rebarck, 172, Cranston, R. I., (6); Joe McGinnis, 186, Peabody, defeated Joe Lydon, 188, Boston (4).

HOLLYWOOD HOTEL SUED BY O.P.A. AS PRICE VIOLATOR

Hollywood, May 26 — (U.P.)—The fashionable Beverly Hills hotel, which has been in more motion pictures than any Hollywood star, was charged with violating price ceilings today in a \$32,593 suit filed by the Office of Price Administration. The treble damage suit also asked that the hotel corporation be enjoined from further violations. Robert L. Moore, chief OPA rent enforcement attorney, said the suit was the largest the OPA has filed against a landlord in this area. The suit charged the hotel collected \$10,864.60 in over-ceiling rents, between July 1 and Dec. 31, 1944 and failed to offer a proper proportion of its rooms for weekly and monthly occupancy.
