**LT. STANLEY BACK HOME AFTER TWO OCEAN SINKINGS**

Lt. Harry Stanley, USNR, is back in the United States on survivor leave after his ship, the destroyer USS Bush, was lost off Okinawa. This is the second time during the war that Lt. Stanley has survived a ship sinking—and the second time without suffering a scratch. He was serving aboard another destroyer, the USS Preston, when it was sunk off Guadalcanal Nov. 15, 1942.

The officer with his parents, Lt. Com. and Mrs. H. A. Stanley, arrived in Medford Friday from San Francisco and Saturday Lt. Stanley continued to Seattle while his parents remained here to visit friends and relatives.

In the water about nine hours and among the last Bush survivors to be picked up, Lt. Stanley claims to be no worse for his experience but wonders if a little shore duty might not be a good thing.

He has a long record of overseas service, a navy dispatch states, with 33 months, all in the Pacific, to his credit. This includes such battles as Santa Cruz, Guadalcanal, the Marianas, Philippines, Iwo Jima and finally Okinawa. Lt. Stanley was gunnery officer of the Bush. Seven stars are on his Asiatic-Pacific ribbon, two on a Philippine Liberation ribbon and besides these he holds the American theater and American defense ribbons.

Lt. Stanley graduated from Medford high school and from the University of Washington in 1942. He was a member of the Delta Upsilon fraternity at the university.

Lt. Com. Stanley is now in the 53rd year with the navy, having returned to active duty in the early days of the present war. The family residence is on Crater Lake highway and they expect to return here when Lt. Com. Stanley is relieved of duty in San Francisco. Another son, Lt. Don Stanley, navy fighter pilot, has been declared missing in action in the Pacific theater. The Stanleys expect to spend considerable time at their summer home on the Rogue.

**BOWERMAN GETS BRONZE STAR IN ITALY CAMPAIGN**

With The Fifth Army, Italy—Major William J. Bowerman, 34, of Medford, recently was awarded the bronze star medal for meritorious service in combat.

He is a regimental staff officer in the 86th Mountain Infantry, 10th Mountain Division, which served on the Fifth Army front during the Italian campaign.

The entry of his regiment into combat for the first time entailed many problems and difficult situations. Bowerman displayed great initiative and foresight in meeting each new problem with such effectiveness as to insure a continuous supply for every unit.

Bowerman was athletic director for Medford schools before entering service in December, 1941. He had received his commission in ROTC at the University of Oregon in 1934.

His wife, Barbara Y. Bowerman, lives at 908 Whitman avenue, Medford.
