San Francisco, May 23.—One never sees the "Rooshians" around Union Square anymore,—they go to the Civic Center in their black "sickle and hammer" limousine and return to the St. Francis in the same manner, the only lively feature being the little red and white flag fluttering madly from the tonneau in the cold Golden-Gate breeze.

That little Russian "sawed-off", with the jug-ears, riding breeches and bronze medals was one of Molotov's favorite body guards and flew back to Moscow with the Commissar. Well THAT is settled; we won't have to look around for HIM any more.

One of the newspaper men at this hotel informed the undersigned this morning he thought the conference had reached the "silly stage"—mature men engaged in serious work debating as to whether the new league should stand for "independence" or "self-government" for dependent nations.

And he was ashamed to say the United States stood out for "self-government" when and if the people of the colony in question are "ready for it."

We cheerfully grant our colleague had something there,—we mean the "when ready for it." That has been the "alibi" of ruling empires since Caesar's day, and only about 150 years ago was England's contention when our own forefathers sought to become Independent of King George III. But there IS a point there.

Take Canada, for example. Canada could have ABSOLUTE Independence if she wished it. But she does NOT wish it. She prefers to be a part of the British Empire with a Governor-General from the "mother-land."

Why FORCE any "colony" to be completely independent, if it doesn't WISH to be? Give it "self government" and let it decide for what it wants and for what it doesn't.

But some people are so hypnotized by Webster's unabridged, "Independence", to them, sounds so much better than "self-government."

Unless "self government" is a phoney and doesn't mean what it says where is there a nation that would ask for MORE than the right to govern ITSELF,—DO whatever a majority of its people WISH to be done? If it wishes Independence—take it.

Far out on 32nd Avenue a meat-shop sports a sign as follows: "Fresh horse-meat daily."

One has heard very little of dirigibles in this war,—the lighter-than-air craft. We don't believe the censor would object if it were stated that dirigibles are used out from the Golden Gate, to escort ships back and forth through what is still considered a possible Jap U-boat zone.

A newspaper man here who has spent 15 years as representative of a press service in the Balkans and environs is very pessimistic regarding any permanent peace from the Baltic to the Black sea. He maintains the people of Poland, Czechoslovakia, Jugoslavia, Rumania, Bulgaria, Greece, Syria, Palestine and way-stations can't agree with anyone, and can't agree among themselves.

We asked him if he thought that true of the East Indians also. "No" was his reply, "they don't like to fight. They only like to TALK about it. That is the trouble. If they had had the Anglo-Saxon yen for strong drink and fistfuffs they would have won their independence long ago. For over 100 years they have had a better chance for independence than the American colonists had in 1776."

As before remarked one can hear all sorts of things at this Peace conference and from persons who should know far more than the average about the subjects they discuss.

No doubt of this: If a tug-of-war should be arranged between the various delegations here, Soviet Russia would win in a walk. Too bad Mack Lillard couldn't have his pick for his next "battle royal." They are a husky bunch!—R.W.R.

Some members of our garden club use the term "arsenic of lead" and insist that is correct. I believe it is arsenate of lead, which is so much used to destroy pests on plants. (Mrs. P. G.)

Anglo-neurotic Edema
My nine-year-old daughter has suffered much from giant hives, mostly in summer, after swimming, eating huckleberries. Have you any information or advice on this? (Mrs. R. G.)

Reference is Not a Copy
I'll be glad to receive a copy of Dr. Jolliffe's original statement which you quoted. You are right. Lead arsenate is the name of the insecticide. Chronic arsenic poisoning may occur from ingestion of residues of the spray left on green leafy vegetables and fruits. Ordinary washing does not certainly remove such residues. Rinsing in dilute hydrochloric acid (muriatic acid) solution in water removes the traces of arsenic, if any. Such a solution is prepared by diluting a pint or pound of standard medicinal Dilute Hydrochloric Acid (10%) with a gallon of water. Rinsing in running water removes all of the hydrochloric acid.

NEVADA DIVORCE RULE HITS 1,251 OREGON COUPLES

Salem, Ore., May 26.—(U.P.)—On June 16 a total of 1,251 married couples in Oregon will be free to change the decision they made to record subject to Oregon's now-voided community property law.

The Oregon law, passed in 1943, was one of two in the United States. Last year the Oklahoma law, from which Oregon's was drawn, was nullified by a decision of the U. S. supreme court.

Under Oregon statute, husband and wife could, if they wished, declare that their property was owned in common. This placed them in a preferred position in paying federal income taxes.

The 1945 legislature repealed that law after the court's decision. It also passed a bill permitting husband and wife to change their choice and another which will save them from certain penalties under the gift tax law.

The legislature also sent requests to all "common law" states, and to Oregon's representatives in congress for the enactment of legislation which would remove the inequalities in the present federal income tax, as a result of the difference.

The difference between "community property" states and "common law" states goes back a long way. The community property states, in which the principle that property is owned jointly is mandatory, draw that principle from tradition and custom.

In some southern states such as Texas and Louisiana, the idea comes from French or Spanish law. There are seven such states, including both Washington and California.

But in the states where laws came chiefly from English common law, there is no such historical principle. In Oregon and Oklahoma, the state legislatures attempted to change that by statute. But the supreme court held that the laws were not valid because they made a community property status optional, rather than mandatory.

Over 700 registrations have been received to date for the Red Cross learn to swim campaign which will be held at the Twin Plunges, Ashland, from June 18 to June 30. Five schools still are to file registrations.

Because of the unprecedented large number, Robert Dodge, water safety chairman, announced that registrations will close Monday evening, which will allow time for all schools whose slips are still out to get them into the Red Cross office, county court house, which will remain open until 5 p. m.

Dodge said Saturday, "I have called San Francisco to get another instructor and received full cooperation to handle the extraordinary response of our offer to teach Jackson county children to swim. Analysis show 83 per cent of this group do not know how to swim. If we can make the arrangements we will also be able to offer the combat swimming course to

the young men graduating from the high school who will be in the services before September." Free transportation arrangements in charge of Seth Bullis, chairman of the Red Cross board, will have to be changed to meet the new situation, it was stated.

Adult volunteers to supervise registration at pools, locker rooms and between swim periods are needed and those willing to assist are asked to contact the Red Cross office as soon as possible.

YOUTH BOUND TO GRAND JURY FOR THEFT OF TOOLS

John R. Anderson, 21, waived preliminary hearing in Justice court Saturday morning and was bound over to the Grand jury, charged with burglary not in a dwelling. In lieu of \$1,000 bail, he was lodged in the county jail.

According to state police who investigated the case, Anderson admitted breaking into Clyde Caton's garage in Ashland Thursday night where he stole about \$2,500 worth of tools. Anderson also admitted a similar theft the night before in Mount Shasta, Calif.

Anderson was apprehended by state police Friday near Rogue River. He was driving a Buick sedan which police believe was stolen in Missouri. Clothes, food and some of the tools were found in the car Anderson was driving. The rest of the tools are believed to be carried by an accomplice who is believed to be driving a maroon 1940 Chevrolet sedan belonging to G. Wannberg, which was stolen in Ashland Thursday night. The accomplice also is believed to have two girl companions with him, police said.
