Wall Street

New York, June 4 — (UP)—Demand for steel shares turned the stock market irregularly higher today after an initial decline.

Wall street quarters attributed the rise in steel shares to circulation of an investment council's prediction of "excellent" future domestic and foreign demand for steel tonnage.

General bullishness reflected a number of favorable news developments, including the decision of the United States Supreme court upholding the right of stockholders to challenge orders of the Securities and Exchange commission affecting their companies.

Utilities, the largest group of listed companies subject to security orders, rose to a new peak since March 31, 1937 on gains ranging to more than two points in such issues as Columbia Gas and Electric 5 preferred and Consumers Power preferred.

Preliminary closing Dow-Jones stock averages: Industrial 168.09, up 10.13; railroad 58.50, off 0.40; utility 31.86, up 0.04; 65 stocks 63.66, off 0.08.
