

SOVIET MAP SETS DEMARCATION LINE

Moscow, June 7 — (UP) — Russian newspapers published today a map of Germany showing the line of demarcation between the zone of Russian occupation and that of the western Allies.

An explanatory note published with the map said the line was decided in an agreement among the governments of Russia, Britain, the United States and France.

The line ran from a point on Luebeck Inlet at the junction of the Mecklenburg and Schleswig-Holstein frontier, along the western border of Mecklenburg, to the border of Hannover province and along its eastern border to the border of Brunswick, then along the western border of Prussian Saxony to the western border of Anhalt, and along its western border and the western

border of Saxony and of Thuringia to the intersection with the Bavarian border and along the northern border of Bavaria to the Czechoslovak border of 1937.

New York, June 7 — (UP) — A flurry of buying in gold shares and strength in individual issues gave the stock market an irregular appearance today. Trading was somewhat lighter.

Demand for gold shares on both the New York stock and curb exchanges followed announcement in Ottawa that the Canadian government had lifted all restrictions on the production of gold and other metals.

On the "big board" gains in the golds ranged to more than a point in McIntyre-Porcupine and Homestake, while on the curb similar gains were noted in Consolidated Mining and Lake Shore Mines.
