**Wife Of Baseball Star Gets Divorce**

Field Hospital, Okinawa, May 5—(UP)—Pvt. Richard A. McCurdy, Boise, Ida., came back from the dead today to tell how Japanese soldiers gouged his eyes, picked his body for souvenirs and kicked and rolled him about to see if he were alive.  
The lanky six foot ex-sawmill hand, now serving with Company E, 7th Division, was hit in the back and arm by 50-caliber machine gun bullets just inside enemy lines.  
While he lay there seemingly dead, Japanese souvenir hunters took his gun and used it to fire back at Americans; took his rations and water canteen and his bilfold. Occasionally they stuck their thumbs in his eyeballs and under his cheek bones. They kicked and rolled his body to see if he were alive.
