KANSAS WHEAT GROWERS FACE HARVEST PROBLEM

Topeka, Kans., June 14—(U.P.) Kansas wheat growers, harassed for more than a year by a box-car shortage which left thousands of bushels of the 1944 crop piled on the prairie lands where it deteriorated for months, faced another problem today.

Gov. Andrew Schoepel reported that growers were concerned over the prospect of obtaining food supplies for harvest bands moving into the area to harvest a new crop, which in turn may be left to deteriorate for want of shipping facilities.
