PRIVATE LACKY DIES OF WOUNDS

Pfc. Richard D. Lacky, 22, of Medford, died May 22 in the 39th General Hospital on Saipan as the result of wounds received in action on Okinawa April 20, a wire to his mother, Mrs. Neil Davidson, 1015 Reddy avenue, stated this morning.

The soldier had been in service since December of 1941, having been inducted into the army from the National Guard. He was a student at Harrisburg high school, near Eugene, at the time. Pfc. Lacky was home on furlough in October of 1944. He held the infantry combat award.

Mrs. Davidson came to Medford from Eugene to reside several years ago.
