Seattle, June 30—(U.P.)—Executive Board of the International Longshoremen's and Warehousemen's Union International wound up sessions here today, following earlier reaffirmation of their no-strike pledge with condemnation of "flank attacks against Russia by U. S. Fascists seeking to destroy democracy in the United States."

Under chairmanship of ILWU President Harry Bridges, San Francisco, the board's resolution stated intention of "cementing relationship with 27,000,000 organized Russian workers through the World Federation of Trade Unions."

A doctor stated that the medical profession does not know the reason why people lose their hair through shock, but in most cases only women are affected.

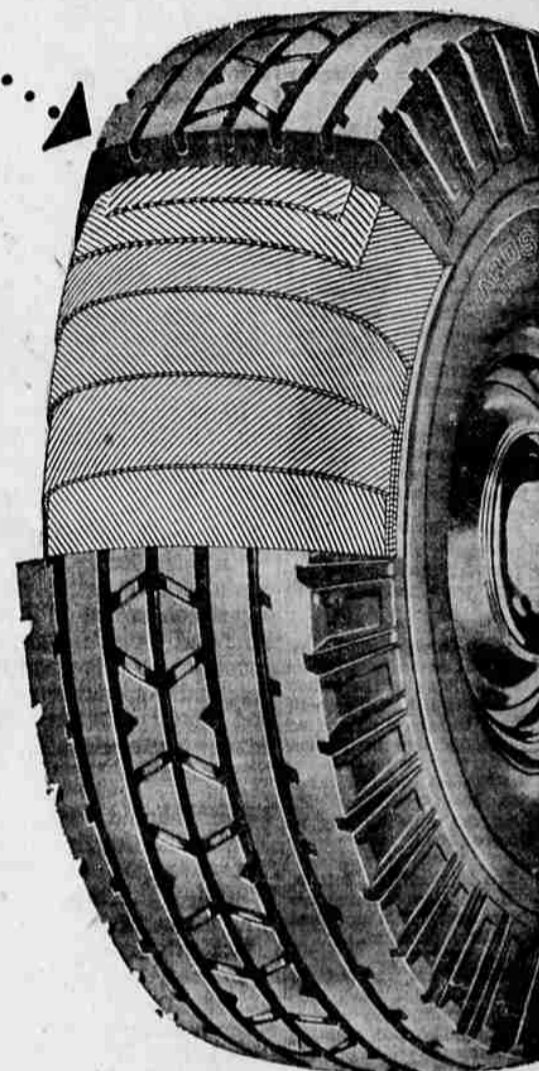
