NATIONAL FOREST RULES ANNOUNCED

Rules for visitors in all national forests were announced yesterday by Karl L. Janouch of the U. S. Forest Service. Beginning today all visitors are required to secure campfire permits to carry shovel, axe and bucket, and are not allowed to smoke except on surfaced high-ways.

Sacramento, June 30 — (U.P.) — The 1945 apricot pack handled by Sacramento canneries will be the lowest in the history of the industry, it was revealed tonight. Strike difficulties were blamed by owners of the canneries.

Three major plants were tied up by a jurisdictional dispute. They resumed packing asparagus with partial crews, and Ber-cut-Richards, one of the plants, announced it will be able to handle "some" apricots.

Plants operated by Libby, McNeill & Libby and California Packing Corp. said they will be unable to handle apricots, but hope to start on peaches about July 25.
