Prices on all used passenger cars have been reduced 4 per cent by an OPA order effective July 1, it was announced today at the local price administration office. The order applies to all cars sold by dealers or private individuals.

Included in the 4 per cent price reduction order are all built-in equipment such as overdrive and transmission, and radios or heaters.
