## CUBS TAKE EIGHT GAMES IN ROW; ON BROOKLYN'S HEELS

**Giants Trim Reds Twice—Detroit Downs Yanks; Chisox Victors.**

New York, July 7—(U.P.)—Manager Charlie Grimm wore a happy smile today as his Chicago Cub express roared down the track with the throttle wide open and the flag-signal indicating "full speed ahead."

Grimm's streamliners made it eight straight today when they vanquished the Philadelphia Phillies, 3 to 0, behind the stellar hurling of lanky Claude Passeau.

Cavarretta, with a double and a single, increased his batting average to .370. The victory kept the high-flying Cubs one game behind the league-leading Brooklyn Dodgers, who outlasted the Cardinals, 10 to 7.

In the American league, Pitcher Newhouse of Detroit registered his 13th victory of the season, beating the Yankees, 3 to 2. The Tigers scored the winning run in the 10th inning on a single by York and a tripe by Cramer.

Chicago increased the woe of Manager Connie Mack of the Athletics by sweeping a double-header from the last-place Mackmen, 1 to 0 and 12 to 4. Wally Moses, veteran White Sox outfielder, stole home in the first inning of the opening game to score the only run of the contest.

The Boston Red Sox belted the Cleveland Indians, 8 to 6, in a contest which saw the lead change frequently.
