A. P. WRITER KILLED AFTER TAKEN BY HUNS

New York, July 10.—(U.P.)—The Associated Press said last night that Joseph Morton, AP war correspondent in the Mediterranean, apparently was executed by the Germans on Jan. 24, 1945, after being captured in Slovakia.

An AP dispatch from Rome said Morton was captured while accompanying a military mission of 17 Americans and British who went to assist Slovak patriots in a revolt last fall. The entire group was captured and all apparently were killed, the dispatch said.
