

LUMBER OUTPUT ALL TO WAR USE SAYS GERLINGER

Portland, Ore., July 12—(U.P.) George Gerlinger, Portland, president of the National Lumber Manufacturers' association took issue with government officials today who have promised lumber for farm and home building in the remaining months of 1945.

Gerlinger said that military and direct war lumber requirements alone will take 80 per cent of the west coast production in the next three months.

"Lumber manufacturers would like nothing better than to make large quantities of this critical material available to home and farm builders at once to help the conversion period ahead," Gerlinger stated, "but our first obligation is to the military services—and today lumber is the most critical of all war materials and a shortage might easily hinder if not actually delay our attack on Japan."

He said that demands for lumber for an attack on the Japanese mainland are consuming the bulk of west coast production, which is the largest share of natural production.

The lumber executive concluded

with the statement that the immediate war job for lumber is the toughest yet faced by the industry and is being made more difficult by a lack of manpower and a shortage of truck tires which have curtailed production to the danger point.
