ARMY VEHICLES TO BE OFFERED FOR SALE HERE

A "spot sale" of used trucks allocated for disposition to farmers of Jefferson, Wasco, Sherman, Gilliam, Morrow and Umatilla counties, will be conducted at the Ordnance Service Command Shop, Medford fair grounds, on Thursday, July 19, at 10 a. m. It was announced today by the office of surplus property in Seattle.

Sales of trucks may be made only to regular retail dealers and farmers' cooperative associations which are dealers, and who agree to resell the trucks to farmers or farmers' cooperative associations in those counties.

139 Vehicles On Sale

A total of 139 trucks and motor vehicles will be offered for sale. Included in the list are 59 stake and cargo trucks, 27 weapon carriers, 14 pickups, 2 express body, and 1 dump, all 1940, 1941, and 1942 models, in fair used condition and most of which require repairs.

Inspection of the vehicles may be made during the two days preceding the sale date, between 9 a. m. and 3 p. m., by contacting the officer in charge at the ordnance shop.

In addition to these vehicles, 36 Dodge, 1½ ton cargo trucks located at the ordnance shop in Bend will be sold by remote control.

The usual "spot" sale method of disposal will prevail, with contracts completed at site upon presentation of certified checks in full payment. Bidders should come prepared to tow vehicles from the site.
