OWEN'S COUSIN AMONG PRISON SHIP VICTIMS

Mr. and Mrs. James H. Owen of Siskiyou Heights have just received word of the death of Mr. Owen's cousin, Capt. W. H. Owen, Jr., in the Jap prison ship which was torpedoed last October by a U. S. submarine.

Captain Owen left San Diego, August 28, 1941, for service in the Philippines and was wounded in the gallant American defense of Corregidor, so severely that he was spared the notorious death march to the Jap prison camp. He had been a prisoner, however, from that time until his death, and members of the family were able to get very little news concerning him. His father and mother, Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Owen of St. Louis, Mo., and his widow, of Lebanon, Mo., survive.
