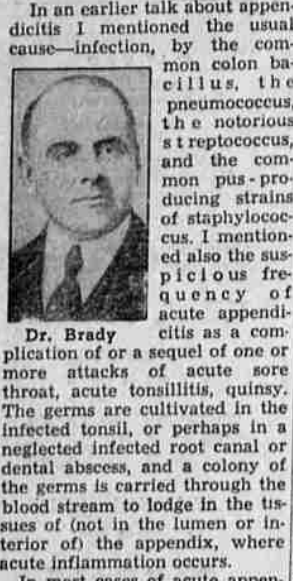

WHY SOME PERSONS GET APPENDICITIS



Dr. Brady explains the cause of acute appendicitis as a complication of one or more attacks of acute sore throat, acute tonsillitis, quinsy. The germs are cultivated in the infected tonsil, or perhaps in a neglected infected root canal of the germs is carried through the blood stream to lodge in the tissues of (not in the lumen or interior of) the appendix, where acute inflammation occurs.

In an earlier talk about appendicitis I mentioned the usual cause—infection, by the common colon bacillus, the pneumococcus, the streptococcus, and the common pus-producing strains of staphylococcus. I mentioned also the suspicious frequency of acute appendicitis as a complication of one or more attacks of acute sore throat, acute tonsillitis, quinsy. The germs are cultivated in the infected tonsil, or perhaps in a neglected infected root canal of the germs is carried through the blood stream to lodge in the tissues of (not in the lumen or interior of) the appendix, where acute inflammation occurs.

In most cases of acute appendicitis the infection is through the blood stream, not directly from the interior of the appendix or the intestine. Even when the attack is due mainly or chiefly to colon bacillus infection, the route is via blood stream from a focus of infection in some distant part of the intestine, say chronic or recurring piles, or a minor intestinal ulcer in large or small intestine. Occasionally the tissue of or surrounding the appendix is infected by direct invasion from the lumen or interior of the appendix or the large intestine (cecum) or head of colon with which the appendix is connected. This is the mode of infection when the inflammation is due to entrance of pinworms or round worms into the appendix, which happens occasionally in children who harbor such parasites, as a good many young children do without any apparent disturbance of their health.

Ordinarily the appendix ad-

mits nothing. Contrary to a common notion lodgment of seeds, bits of fruit skin or peel, bird shot, needles, pins, hair, pennies, marbles, teeth, chalk, sand, bran gum or other foreign or undigestible matter, is only rarely if ever a contributing cause of appendicitis. Even the presence of pinworms or round worm, revealed at operation, is debatable, as a contributing cause of the appendicitis, in the opinion of many good physicians. They maintain, with much experience in exploratory surgery (opening for inspection) that the parasites, when present in the intestine, often lodge in the appendix without any apparent disturbance of the host's comfort or health. Moreover it is the present belief of most physicians and surgeons that such foreign bodies lodge in the appendix rather as a consequence of one or more attacks of appendicitis, for, as already mentioned, a healthy normal appendix does not admit food or other substances.

By now I hope you will have forgotten that I have not acknowledged any other cause of appendicitis than bacterial infection. But let your bowels alone and next time I'll give my idea, since there is no consensus of medical opinion, about the predisposing factors of appendicitis.

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS
Activity of Prospective Mother

Whoooping Cough
How long after a child has contracted whooping cough will he be able to give it to others? (D. M.)
Answer—Generally for not more than three weeks after onset of the whoop—and the whoop usually begins only after a week or ten days of incessant coughing. So the child should remain out of school and isolated from contact with other children for about a month.

CHENNAULT HITS CHINA'S CRITICS
Kunming, July 17—(U.P.)—Maj. Gen. Claire L. Chennault, commander of the 14th airforce, prepared today to enter retirement for the second time after placing on record a vigorous attack upon critics of the Chinese government.
Speaking at a press conference at which his decision to retire was announced, Chennault said: "I am shocked by the attacks against the Chinese government and armies made by certain irresponsible persons in the United States. The Chinese government and armies are no more without fault than other governments and armies."
Chennault refrained from commenting on the real factors behind his decision to give up his command with Japan's defeat in sight.

FAVOR UNITED AIR LINE FOR SERVICE IN HAWAII
Washington, July 17—(U.P.)—A Civil Aeronautics board examiners' report today recommended that United Air Lines be certified to operate a route between Los Angeles, San Francisco, and Honolulu.
This would be in addition to Pan American Airways service to Hawaii.
Fare for a one-way trip to Honolulu would be \$125 and for a round trip \$225 starting either from Los Angeles or San Francisco, United Air Lines said. The routes would start as soon as war conditions permit. The trip would take 10 1/2 hours.
