

SALVAGE PICKUP IN COUNTY WILL START ON MONDAY

Pickup of paper and tin cans by the Shriners salvage committee will start Monday morning, according to an announcement by John Rolston, chairman. Medford Army has been established as the main salvage depot and all collections will be accumulated there.

Arrangements have been made for collections from rural areas with state highway trucks to bring salvage from outlying depots to the main depot.

Outlying Depots
Outlying depots have been established at Butte Falls, Eagle Point, Trail, Prospect, Jacksonville, Rogue River, Berrydale, (near Big Y Market), Ruch, Applegate store, Oak Grove (Shores filling station), Sams Valley store, Table Rock store, Central Point, Brownsboro, Lake Creek, Shady Cove, McLeod, Gold Hill, Phoenix, Talent and Foothills Creek service station.

All bundles must be securely tied, covers must be removed from books, and cartons and cardboard boxes must be flattened and bundled. Wax paper cannot be used, the committee said.

Collection will start at 9 a. m. Monday and all bundles of paper should be placed on the curb. In the business district, bundles must be placed in normal loading zones.

AIRPLANE SPRAY IS PLANNED HERE TO PREVENT DROP

Arrangements for airplane spraying of at least 400 acres of Rogue River Valley pear trees have been made by local shipping organizations with the Sherwin-Williams company North Pacific administration at Yakima, Wash. It was announced today by officials of the company visiting Medford.

An airplane from the Central Aircraft corporation at Yakima will arrive about the first week in September, to apply "Stop-Drop," a product developed to prevent excess dropping of fruit before maturity. The product was developed in 1940 for ground application by the U. S. Department of Agriculture, and the Sherwin-Williams company has adapted it to airplane application and pioneered research work in Washington, with cooperation of the aircraft corporation, it was stated.

Tests carried out last year in Yakima and Wenatchee proved very successful, with spraying carried out on 1,200 acres of commercial apples and pears. Costs of the airplane application are approximately the same as ground application, according to the representatives of the Sherwin-Williams company.

U. S. troops found enough food, weapons and ammunition in Aoyagi's hideout to last a year. A large part of it had been captured from American forces.

CANNING MEETING THURSDAY, FRIDAY, USO AUDITORIUM

Information on canning and freezing fruits will be presented by Mrs. Vivian Freeman, canning authority, and Miss Marian Farrell, home demonstration agent, at a meeting in the USO auditorium at 1:30 p. m. Thursday. A similar demonstration given in Ashland yesterday, was attended by 185 women. A second session will be held here on Friday, at the same time and place.

According to Miss Farrell, Medford homemakers will have a greater opportunity to receive helpful suggestions since the demonstration will be divided into two meetings.

Thursday's demonstration will be devoted to the preservation of fruits, giving special emphasis to sugar saving suggestions. On Friday, particular emphasis will be placed on canning and freezing vegetables and the use of the pressure cooker. Mrs. Freeman

will allow time for answering questions at each meeting.

Since this is the only series of food preservation demonstrations to be given this summer in Medford, Miss Farrell urges that all Jackson county homemakers plan to attend both sessions.
