Make separate bundles of newspapers, magazines and flattened cardboard cartons. Tie in medium-sized bundles easy to handle. Start saving today and add to the pile every day. Keep it in a dry place.

**WHY TIN CANS  
ARE URGENTLY  
NEEDED**

Japan still controls the lands from which we used to import most of our tin. Tin is vital to the war effort. Every tin can turned in to the war effort helps supply the tin needed in modern warfare. Tin is used on every ship, every tank, every airplane. Tin is used to package fuses, to make pain-relieving syrettes and for hundreds of other items.
