## MORE PEARS SEEN IN FALL HARVEST

Picking of the Rogue River Valley pear crop will start about Aug. 15, according to a statement by the Rogue River Valley Traffic association. Latest estimates indicate a larger crop than last year. Combined estimates indicate there will be 287,000 more boxes than last year when there were 1,942,000 boxes.

Bosc pears are the only variety which seem to be under last year. Last year there were 582,828 boxes of Bosc and this year's estimate is 562,028 boxes. Other varieties are all over a year ago with Bartletts estimated at 880,800 boxes compared to 817,124 last year, Howells estimated at 9,400 compared to 8,041 a year ago, Comice estimated at 85,700 compared to 60,220 last year, DeAnjou estimated at 475,700 compared to 434,394 a year ago, Seckles at 13,000 com-

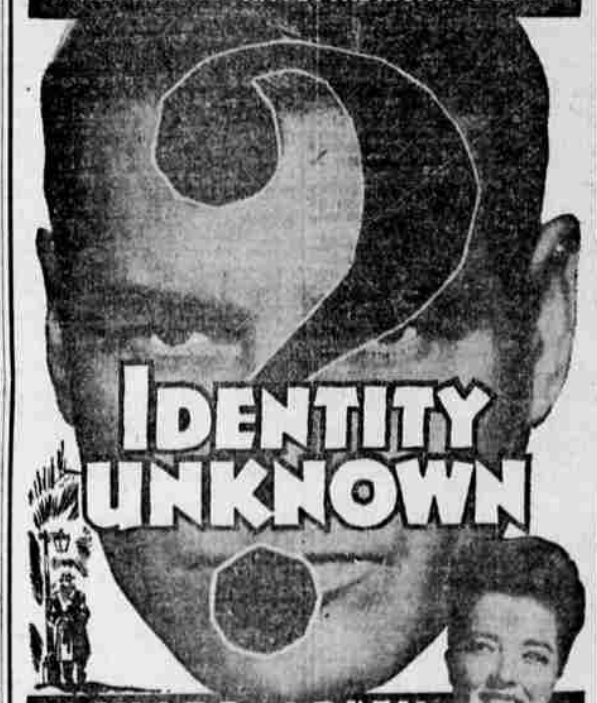
