What Is Socialism?

"With England turning to Socialism, the United States is left the only large capitalistic country in the world." —U. P. dispatch.

Before we agree with this well known by-line writer's dictum, we would like a clearer definition of terms.

Just what IS Socialism? According to the "Britannica" Socialism is—we quote:

"That policy or theory which aims at securing by the action of the central democratic authority a better distribution, and in due subordination thereto, a better production of wealth than now prevails."

If that definition is correct then, of course, the victory of the Labor party in England could properly be called a victory for Socialism.

BUT also if that definition is correct, then this country, at least under Franklin Delano Roosevelt, has had a socialistic regime.

For no one would deny that the fundamental POLICY of the Democratic party for the past dozen years has been just that: to secure a better distribution of wealth, with a better production of wealth subordinated to it.

BUT that is NOT the definition of socialism, according to the Socialists—at least those we know.

They advocate the IMMEDIATE public ownership and operation of ALL large industries, ALL natural resources, elimination of the private and competitive profit system, also the elimination of war, and of all foreign dictatorships INCLUDING that of Soviet Russia!

IN OTHER WORDS as far as the "AIMS" of Socialism are defined in general terms, not only the United States has been socialistic for over a decade, but England has been "socialistic" for 40 years. For it was a fairer and better distribution of wealth that was the chief aim of the late David Lloyd George, through the imposition of huge income taxes, the breaking up of the large private estates, doles, pensions and so on and so forth—the heart of the liberal party platform.

However, as far as the concrete policies of Socialism are concerned, through which to bring about this "better order," England has not only NOT adopted Socialism in the past—nor has this country—but there is no indication that England expects to do so under the new Labor government—at least in the near future.

THE policy of government ownership and operation in England will be extended, no doubt.

In the recent campaign labor leaders, in fact, promised public ownership for coal mines, railroads, electric light and power, and even the Bank of England. But all these changes could be made in the British home economy and still it could not be accurately stated England had gone "socialistic."

For as above indicated a socialistic state is a state where ALL big industries, ALL big businesses are government-owned and operated, where the private-profit-free-enterprise system has been completely abandoned, and an entirely new economy adopted—a completely NEW system.

THE point we wish to make is this:

The recent labor landslide in England does not mean England has gone socialistic, or that the capitalistic, private-profit system has been abandoned, leaving the United States out on a limb, the only capitalistic country left in the world.

It merely means, as before stated, a sharp turn to the left—the EXTENSION of a socialized economy, rather than its inauguration or complete adoption.

ULTIMATELY England may become a socialistic state. So, for that matter, may the United States. The trend certainly throughout the world for half a century has been in that direction. And that trend has been tremendously accelerated by the world war now drawing toward an end.

But extending socialistic reforms on a capitalistic base is one thing, adopting Socialism as a national program and abandoning the capitalistic system quite another.

By the election of a labor government England has done the first, but not the second. Until the latter has been done, it is incorrect and misleading to declare England has gone socialistic.—R.W.R.

What Is Communism?

As a postscript to the above a clearer definition of political terms might well be extended to Communism also.

What is Communism? Nine out of ten people would no doubt answer it is the sort of government that prevails in Soviet Russia.

But those who know about such things declare this is not true. Communism means the abolition of all private property and holding the same in common.

BUT in Russia 75% of the people own nothing. The state owns most of the land and all the large industries, while the state is controlled by a small group of bureaucrats presided over by the supreme dictator of all—Generalissimo Stalin.

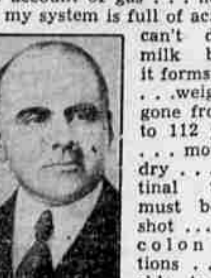
This is a socialistic dictatorship, not communism—at least so the experts claim, although pro-Russian enthusiasts like to point to the Soviet Constitution as democratic.

Whatever Communism is or isn't, we believe a clear-cut definition of the term by some political Supreme Court would clear the atmosphere and be of great service to a somewhat bewildered world in its present predicament.—R.W.R.

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS Dry Eyes My eyes have no tears and always seem so dry when I cook onions and cry some they feel better. Would this be sinus trouble? Answer: It may be from one thing or another but the first thing to make sure of is that you get enough vitamins. Try taking cod liver oil capsules or fish liver oil daily for a few months. If that is repugnant, take one capsule of natural vitamin A (25,000 units) twice daily, after food. If this proves what you need, you should notice relief within a week, but as you can't discontinue the vitamin when the trouble seems "cured" until you are content to drop back into the same nutritional deficiency state. One doesn't stop taking bread, meat or vegetables when one's appetite is satisfied and hunger appeased.
