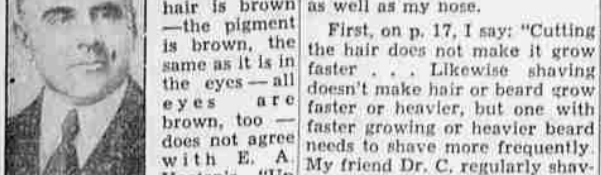

"Rush Week" At University Set For September 9

University of Oregon, Eugene—Plans have been made for a sorority "rush week" to open on the campus Sunday Sept. 9. Mrs. Golda Parker Wickham, acting dean of women, has asked that all women coming to the campus for this rush period send in their applications by August 25. No applications, she warns, will be accepted after that date. Rush week will be housed, this year, in the dormitories, and a \$15 fee is being charged to defray costs of room and board and the Panhellenic fee. Rush week will open with the traditional Open House to which all rushees are invited. Preferential dating starts Monday, Sept. 10, and continues through Tuesday and Wednesday with a preference dinner planned for Thursday night. Bids will be given out Friday morning and girls accepting these will then move out of the dormitories into the houses and prepare for Freshman Week, which opens Sept. 17.

Ex-Klan Dragon Claims Frame-Up

Noblesville, Ind., Aug. 1—(U.P.) D. C. Stephenson today broke a 20-year silence to announce that fear of mob violence kept him from testifying in his own behalf in a 1925 murder trial. The former Grand Dragon of the Ku Klux Klan filed six affidavits in circuit court in an effort to prove that he was "framed."

He was sentenced to life imprisonment for the murder of Madge Oberholzer of Indianapolis.

ENROLLMENT HIKE AT UNIVERSITY IS SEEN FOR AUTUMN

University of Oregon, Eugene—A sharp upswing in enrollment is in prospect at the University of Oregon this fall with more than 500 freshman applications for admittance already in. The trend is definite toward the high pre-war level.

With a capacity enrollment in prospect the administration is urging that all students file applications for housing at an early date. If the university administration is advised in time there will be ample housing for all. Dean Karl W. Onthank, head of personnel administration, believes. But, he advises, time must be allowed so that preparations can be made.

Applications for dormitory rooms are being received by Mrs. Genevieve Turnipseed, director of dormitories. The co-operative houses on the campus, four for women and one for men, are now taking applications from qualified students. And two new sororities—Delta Zeta and Zeta Tau Alpha—will swell the capacity of the sororities on the campus.

Warning is given that rooms off the campus will be scarce and students should not rely on obtaining housing from this source. The only certain way to obtain housing, Dean Onthank states, is to file application for the desired university facilities immediately.

Dentist Invents Compressed Air Drilling Device

Chicago, Aug. 1—(U.P.)—The days of the dreaded dentist's drill may be numbered. The American Dental Association journal announced in its August issue today that a new method of drilling teeth has been developed in which a stream of compressed air is substituted for the conventional drill, eliminating pain, heat and vibration.

The association describes the new technique as "revolutionary." It was developed by a Texas dentist, Dr. Robert B. Black, Corpus Christi, who said in his report that his method, named "Abrasive," employs for its action a very fine, almost pinpoint stream of compressed air into which a suitable finely divided abrasive agent has been introduced.

Dr. Black said that though he had used the drill on a limited number of patients, all preferred the new method. The apparatus resembles the conventional drill but it has no moving parts to make a grinding sound nor to cause discomfort usually associated with tooth repair, Dr. Black said.
