University Sets Rush Week Date For September 9

Plans for the annual fall term "rush week" at the University of Oregon are being completed in Eugene this month by Mrs. Golda Parker Wickham, acting dean of women at the university, who has announced that rushing will begin on the campus Sunday, Sept. 9. All girls planning to take part in the rushing period are asked to send applications to the dean by Aug. 25.

Rushes will be housed this year in the dormitories, and a \$15 fee is being made to defray costs of room and board and the Panhellenic fee, Mrs. Wickham states.

The traditional "open house" will open rush week, with all rushees visiting each sorority house in supervised groups. Preferential dating starts Monday, Sept. 10, and continues through Tuesday and Wednesday with a final preference dinner planned for Thursday night.

Bids from the sororities will be distributed through the dean's office Friday morning, and girls

accepting them will move from the dormitories into the houses. Freshman week will open Sept. 17 on the campus, registration for fall term will be Sept. 21 and 22, and classes will begin Monday, Sept. 24.

Sorority women from Medford, planning to return to the University this fall, will leave soon after the first of September to prepare the houses for rush period.

Sorority rushing in Medford this summer has been informal. An organized Panhellenic tea, at which representatives of all national sororities on the University of Oregon campus will be present, is being held in Portland today.
