**Your Health and It's Care**

**WHO NEEDS A WEE NIP OF IODINE?**  
 Speaking for 'Ol Doc Brady, who assumes full responsibility for everything printed in this column and is always prepared to back it up with never known knowledge, practical experience or a thorough medical opinion, if any physician or health authority honestly challenges the assertion or teaching—or teaching—I say it isn't so much a question of who needs a wee nip of iodine but rather who doesn't.



**Dr. Brady**  
 In the first place it is now universally recognized that the body requires a certain amount of iodine every day or at least every week to maintain good nutrition, good physical and mental health. In this sense the element iodine is as essential in nutrition as is the element iron or the element calcium. In this talk I refer to nutritional iodine, not to any familiar preparation of medicinal iodine.

Although it may be that nutritional iodine, in the natural form occurring in sea food—fish, oysters, lobster, clam, shrimp, crab etc., kelp, Irish moss, sardines, fresh, canned, salt or smoked salmon, herring, etc.—is slightly more available for assimilation than iodine or iodides obtained from the source of most of the iodine used today, the nitrate beds of Northern Chile, the evidence of this is not convincing. When I take my own nip of iodine I don't care whether it is obtained from one source or the other.

It is impracticable to list here the many conditions which a suitable daily ration of iodine or iodide prevents or improves or corrects. If you want to know how and why every member of your family should take

his or her wee nip of iodine—that is, every one not under the care of a physician—send me a stamped self addressed envelope and ask for (in writing—I do not read clippings) the pamphlet "Iodine Ration".  
 That spelling Iodin, without the final e, is my own, not Webster's, and I use it to show I mean the element required in nutrition, not the comparatively strong preparations commonly used as medicine.  
 In the revised edition of the pamphlet "Iodine Ration", recently published, I have at last cleared away all the anxiety, fear, uncertainty and confusion, much of it rather gleefully whipped up by unpleasant salespeople who seem to take pleasure in embarrassing timid-looking people who ask for iodine. From now on we don't care how many different strengths of iodine there are, nor whether the stuff has a poison label or not, nor what percentage of alcohol the label mentions. There is no excuse for argument about the strength, alcoholic content or "poisonous" character of the preparation I recommend for nutritional purpose, because it has only one "strength", contains no alcohol and is food, not poison.
